Deficit for 2018

St Peter's is a very important part of the lives of many people. This includes the people that are here today, those that we don't see every week, and those we don't know, but whose lives we've touched.

In the past year we've strengthened our connections to the larger community through offering Messy Church, building bonds with the other Episcopal Churches in the area, and opening our building to community music lessons and concerts.

We've baptized two babies and supported high schoolers on their Journey to Adulthood.

We continue to support the community through the community meal, Underwear Because We Care, and Thanksgiving and Christmas giving to those in need.

St. Peter's has also experienced, and continues to experience, a number of challenges. We've lost several families, some through retirement and some for other reasons. We have a building that is more than 50 years old, and requires repairs and updates. As a result, for 2018 we expect to face a budget deficit of about \$17,000.
