Mental Illness & King Nebuchadnezzar in Daniel 4

Genesis 3:17: All creation suffers the effects of sin. Romans 8:18-25: All creation suffers the effects of sin and longs for Christ's return

Mental illness is a real struggle(see quote), but we must refrain from calling specific instances not found in the Bible a curse from God. When we do this, it is an assertion that we know the mind of God. Isaiah 55 reminds us that He is God and we are not. We are His dearly loved people, and we rest confidently in what He reveals to us about Himself in His Holy Scriptures.

Isaiah 55:8-9: God's thoughts and ways are not our own.

"It is estimated that 1 in 5 adults will experience a diagnosable mental illness in any given year. (This figure is 1 in 6 for children between ages 6 and 17.) The more prevalent illnesses, which account for 80% of cases, are the anxiety disorders, major depression, the substance use disorders and the trauma-based disorders."
