O LITTLE FLOCK, FEAR NOT THE FOE | LSB 666



Jesus said, "Fear not, little flock, for it is your Father's good pleasure to give you the kingdom" (Luke 12:32). His promise gives us courage to press on while Satan's wrath storms around us.

Stanza 1

O little flock, fear not the foe Who madly seeks your overthrow; Dread not his rage and pow'r. And though your courage sometimes faints, His seeming triumph o'er God's saints Lasts but a little hour.

Stanza 3

Don't be afraid! Our Father's Word is stronger than Satan's crew. Their strength? Their might? A joke! A thin curtain! Satan's crew struck Jesus with hammers and nails, and they laid Him in a sealed and guarded tomb. But Jesus, God's Word Incarnate, struck back in victory over Satan's crew — for us. Jesus always wins!

Stanza 4

Amen, Lord Jesus, grant our prayer; Great Captain, now Thine arm make bare, Fight for us once again! So shall Thy saints and martyrs raise A mighty chorus to Thy praise Forevermore, Amen.

Saints and martyrs? It is no joke that Satan killed John the Baptist, Stephen, James, Peter, Paul, and countless martyrs through the centuries. Yet, even now, "Thy saints and martyrs raise a mighty chorus to Thy praise." And every time we gather in the Divine Service, we sing with them. And we will sing again in the presence of Jesus.
