

MOPS

MOPS (Mothers of Preschoolers) is for all moms with infants, toddlers, and preschoolers. St. Paul's MOPS group offers a caring atmosphere where a mom is reminded that she is not alone, has an opportunity to share concerns, make friends, explore areas of creativity and more. MOPS is led *by* mothers *for* mothers, with the addition of three Mentor Moms who have "been there, done that."

We begin each 2-hour MOPS meeting with a homemade breakfast and talk time. Then we feature a guest speaker, Mentor mom devotion, occasional make-and-take craft projects, other fun activities, and time to visit with other women just like you. During meetings, children enjoy a safe, nurturing childcare program. Outside meetings, we plan play dates, field trips to St. Louis attractions, family picnics and our popular Mom's Night Out.

MOPS meets from 9:00am to 11:00am on the first and third Thursdays from September to May. No matter where you live, or where your church is (or if you have no church home) -- **you** are invited to join our MOPS group at St. Paul's!

MOPS (Mothers Of Preschoolers) exists to meet the needs of every mom – stay-at-home and working moms, single, and married moms – moms with different lifestyles who all share a similar desire to be the very best moms they can be! Mothers not only need a sense of belonging, they also need to reach out to each other ... ask questions, make connections, make friends.

A special feature of MOPS is our mentor mom who has "been there, done that" ... whose grown children's lives bear witness that you, too, will survive mom-hood! MOPS is an international organization with more than 3,000 groups and over 100,000 women who meet in the United States and around the world.

What Is a Meeting Like?

We begin each 2-hour MOPS meeting at St. Paul's with a homemade breakfast and fellowship time. Our mentor mom shares from her heart in a specially-prepared devotion. Then we feature a guest speaker, occasional make-and-take craft projects, other fun activities, and plenty of time to visit with other women just like you. Our variety of guest speakers will inform and inspire you. Each year, we enjoy presentations on relevant topics such as parenting, marriage, stress management, faith, health and wellness, cooking, organization, safety, sleep, and more. We always plan time for discussions in small groups so you can get to know other moms and our mentors.

Outside of the meetings, we plan get-togethers such as play dates, field trips to St. Louis attractions, family picnics, book club and our popular monthly Mom's Night Out. We have a great year lined up ... just for you! Thousands of MOPS groups meet in churches all over the United States and we are delighted to offer this group to St. Paul's moms and the community!

MOPPETS - children's program

When you arrive at MOPS you will be pleasantly surprised at all that we have to offer you, as well as your children! While you are in the meeting area enjoying the company of other women, your child(ren) will be enjoying a safe, nurturing atmosphere with kids their own age in our MOPPETS program. Childcare is provided for children up to kindergarten. Infants, up to the age of 6 months, are welcome to remain with mom in the MOPS meeting room. Infant caregivers can bring older infants to you, if necessary, for feeding or comforting.

The children will be divided between rooms based upon age and individual needs. Each room will have a paid lead teacher and caring volunteers to reach an age-appropriate teacher-child ratio. St. Paul's Lutheran Church is equipped with a nursery for infants up to age 1, and three preschool areas - one for younger toddlers, one for preschoolers, and one for Pre-K and kindergarten age children. Each room is packed with fun, safe toys and learning tools to keep them busy and active. If your child needs you, we will promptly find you in the meeting room.

For the older children, we offer a preschool-like setting, where youngsters are exposed to a light teaching atmosphere without any pressure. The specialized curriculum is presented by our MOPPETS teachers and then each child can indulge in crafts, reading or play. We use a variety of different learning materials, including Bible stories, songs, and games. The little ones will use their energy and curiosity to learn about Moses, the parting of the Red Sea, Queen Esther, and more! We even have a music lady, trained in Kindermusik who provides all children in MOPPETS a special opportunity to play musical instruments, dance and sing songs. It's a unique setting and experience, full of love and fun.

Guidelines:

Our childcare rooms start at age six months; younger babies stay with their mothers during the meeting. You may drop off children between 8:45am and 9:00am. Please pick up children promptly after the meeting ends. Snacks are provided. On occasion, we know a child (older than six months) may need to leave the childcare area to be with you, but we ask that these exceptions be infrequent.
