The table of bread and cup has been made ready. It is a table of companionship with Jesus, and with all those who love him. It is the table of sharing with the poor of the world, with whom Jesus found fellowship. It is the table of communion with the earth, to which Christ became incarnate. So come to this table, you who have much faith, and you who would like to have more; you who often partake of this sacrament, and you who so seldom; you who have tried to follow Jesus, and you who have failed. Come. It is Christ himself who invites us to meet him here this day.

Let us pray:

Blessed are you, O God,

for you have brought forth bread from the earth.

Blessed are you, O God,

for you have created the fruit of the vine.

In the beginning you watered the earth that all might have food and drink. You gave bread to your servants Sarah and Abraham to sustain their family on their journey. You called Moses and the Hebrew people out of bondage and nourished them with food in the wilderness. You gave Mary and Joseph their daily bread to share.
