"Pray. Pray diligently. Pray purposely. Pray confidently." One of the many blessings we Americans enjoy is peace. Currently, our country is not at war with another. Should the threat of war become imminent, our powerful and highly trained soldiers in the Armed Forces give us some peace. Still, I wonder if we and our fellow Americans feel "at peace."

Can we be at peace when random acts of violence occur within our nation? What have we seen in the last few weeks? School shootings, sniper ambushes in Idaho, and story after story that tell of criminals wanted for various degrees of assault or murder. And what about those serving our country in a foreign country?

It seems as though the war in the Middle East has come to a ceasefire. Praise God. But could there be nasty ramifications of the United States' involvement? Many serving in the Middle East have gotten their tours extended. Others in the Navy and Air Force have been deployed. Is lasting peace among those nations? If so, at what cost? Jesus told us what to expect before the end of the world came. "You will hear of wars and rumors of wars, but see to it that you are not alarmed. Such things must happen, but the end is still to come.⁷ Nation will rise against nation, and kingdom against kingdom." (Mt. 24:6-7)

The problem is that war remains a part of life in this sinstricken world. Friends and family members who have dangerous jobs can keep us up at night and cause anxiety. In many ways, we know that we're powerless to bring safety or help to them. So what can we do?

Let me suggest three daily exercises that can give you peace:

First, remember who is in control. Our Lord Jesus continues to rule over the whole world, governing all that happens between every nation. His will is always perfect. Look back to the Old Testament. God allowed even wicked, enemy nations to overtake the people of Israel (Assyria and Babylon to name a few). Why? God's purpose

was to lead his own children to repentance, to turn back to him in faith. No matter what happens, God is faithful to you and his mercy endures forever. He is the Lord, who wants all people to be saved.

Second, find peace in His peace. Jesus went to war for you to bring the kind of peace you need most - peace with God. Because of Jesus, God's wrath is not against you and me. Because of Jesus, we have forgiveness for every attack we've launched against God. Because of Jesus, we are reconciled to God now and forever. Put your worry to rest, and put your faith in Jesus. "Therefore, since we have been declared righteous by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ." (Ro. 5:1)

The last advice is simple, but effective: Pray. Pray diligently. Pray purposely. Pray confidently. Those you love who are serving far away need your prayers for protection and peace. Those who have families living halfway across the world need your prayers for strength, patience, and trust in God's will.

We Pray:

Lord God, we praise you for the peace that your Son, Jesus Christ, has given to us when he redeemed us from sin's curse. Through Him, you have promised peace to all those who trust in You. We ask that you bring peace within our country and everywhere.

Especially we pray that you protect our brothers in Christ, Sam Feddersen and Charles Johnson, as they serve you and our country in dangerous territories. Assure them that you are with them and that your almighty hand is there protecting them. Send your angels to guard and keep them. Lead them to place their confidence in Jesus, the Prince of Peace and King of the Universe. If it is your will, bring them home safely and soon.

And finally, we commit their families and friends to your care. Lead them to place their trust in your grace and mercy, trusting that your plans for them is to bring them safely to their eternal home. In His name we pray, Amen.

BUDGET UPDATE BY: SEAN CASE, TREASURER

We have started to see some improvement in offerings over the prior month, which is great news! Overall we are still in a slump as total expenses exceeded offerings by \$7,242 this month, and by \$20,895 for the year.. The only items we paid for this month that were not on the Must Pay list were our Mission Offering to the Synod (\$765). The net result is a decrease to our operating account, now at \$10,228. This is well below the \$15,000 needed to pay our normal must fund bills. This also means we are now using up the \$12,000 we borrowed from our capital improvement fund.

Please continue to pray for our council to make the best decisions for the use of the funds that we do have available, and for the financial well-being of our congregation to allow us to continue to spread the Good News of Christ.
