Unusual Kindness

In 2022, my wife and I attended a WELS church in Wisconsin on a slushy day in the spring. The music? Beautiful. The sermon? Excellent. Our prayers and praise? Uplifting! Everything about our worship that morning was great except for one thing: our welcome. The sad truth is that from the moment we stepped into the church to the moment we walked out, not a single person greeted us or even took time to say 'hello.' As you can imagine, it was very disheartening. We had consumed a five-star meal of spiritual food throughout the service but ended up leaving with a sour taste in our mouths. Why? Because no one showed us kindness.

Kindness is key – a necessary ingredient in God's recipe book for his people. Our God isn't merely concerned that we ponder and proclaim the gospel in truth. He's also mindful that we do so with kindness. Listen to Paul's encouragement to an early, Christian church: "Therefore, as God's chosen people, holy and dearly loved, clothe yourselves with compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness and patience." (Col. 3:12 – NIV)

You have heard it said that 'one act of kindness goes a long way' and that today, 'kindness is rare.' According to Paul, kindness ought to be a something we wear every day! When you get dressed in the morning, don't just put your socks on. Add kindness as a layer to your outfit. Accessorize with kindness (not just speaking to the ladies of our congregation).

When we left that church in Wisconsin, how likely do you think it was that we come back the following Sunday? Well, certainly less likely than if someone had taken the time to greet us. It's not hard, is it? "Hi! How are you? I'm _____, it's great to meet you! Are you from here? ... and so on."

Kindness matters. Can we as God's holy people gathered at Shepherd of the Bay, follow Paul's exhortation? To an extent, we already are. "Pastor, you (meaning, y'all) have such a nice and welcoming church here." I hope that y'all take that as a compliment.

People want to feel welcome when they come to church, whether for the very first time or whether it's the $586^{\rm th}$ time they've come to God's house. And I pray that our kindness is continued and contagious.

Could we make becoming an exceptionally kind congregation a goal of ours in October? Actually, why stop there? How about for the next church year, beginning in November? Now we're talking! What if we could be so bold and motivated that we make kindness a landmark of our church forever? Lord willing, if we are still worshiping in this building in 2030, may every single person who enters the front doors be welcomed with unusual kindness. Please consider how can you clothe yourself with kindness, compassion, humility, gentleness, and patience on a Sunday morning. If you see someone you don't know, tell them that you're happy that they are here! Introduce yourself, learn their name, ask about their story. Invite them to stick around after church for coffee and refreshments! Tell them that you hope to see them next Sunday because, after all, that's the truth. We hope everyone comes to hear once again about the love of God in Jesus Christ. God gives us enough reason to be kind to others: God has been unbelievably kind to us in sending a Savior from sin. Moreover, He commands us to be kind!

When a person goes to a new church for the first time, he isn't always welcomed with genuine kindness. As we continue to serve and connect with our community, wouldn't it be a blessing to build that positive reputation? Only God knows the fruit that may come from a reputation as the "unusually kind" congregation. Our hearts will overflow with kindness as we remember the all-so-important truth at the beginning of this Bible verse: that God has made each of us holy and He dearly loves us.

Prayer:

Compassionate and Kind Father, we praise you for your kindness to us, not treating us as our sins deserve, but punishing your Son for us. In your mercy, hear our prayers. Cause your Word to work genuine kindness in our hearts, that in all we say and do, we reflect your kindness to all those around us. Through our kindness to others, lead more and more people to see the goodness of God to the glory of your name. Amen.

I humbly share that our operating account continues to be drawn down, as offerings in September once again fell short of our monthly expenses. This month, we experienced a deficit of \$3,318. Since the beginning of the year, our expenses have exceeded offerings by \$20,906. We remain committed to careful stewardship. The only expenses paid this month beyond our essential "Must Pay" list were Mission Offering to the Synod — \$765 and Lightbulbs & ballast — \$78.

As a result, our operating account now stands at \$7.127—well below the \$15,000 typically needed to meet our regular obligations. This also includes using \$5.000 of the \$12,000 we borrowed from our capital improvement fund to help bridge the gap. Looking ahead, we are grateful that a \$23,176 CD will mature in November. These funds will be transferred into our operating account to help sustain our ministry in the coming months.
