THE SHEPHERD'S VOICE BY PASTOR NATHAN WONG

This past March, my family and I decided to brave the trip to D.C. to see the renowned cherry blossoms. Aside from the fact that a million people joined us that Friday, it was a quaint day. We walked along the path leading from the Mall toward the Jefferson Memorial where we got to see "Big Tom."

As you walk along the path, you're sandwiched between the Potomac River on one side, and a bunch of cherry blossom trees on the other. Delightfully, my family and I inspected the beauty of those trees on our stroll. It's amazing how healthy, vibrant, and strong those cherry blossom trees are. I got to thinking, "I wonder how long they've been here." A quick Google Search informed me that they've been there since 1912 when the Japanese gave this gift of friendship to America. How could they be in such great condition over a century later? Well, they're planted right next to the river. Their roots have immediate access to the water. The result? A lush tree with a full bloom every season.



Blessed is the one ... whose delight is in the law of the Lord,

and who meditates on his law day and night. That person is like a tree planted by streams of water,

which yields its fruit in season and whose leaf does not wither— whatever they do prospers. (Psalm 1:1-3)

The psalmist declares that those who delight in God's Word and meditate on his law are blessed. When you spend time in your Bible or your daily "Meditations" book, God provides you with His lifegiving water. Not only does it provide much needed refreshment, but His Word also keeps you spiritually healthy and even causes you to grow!

For many people, the start of the new school year means busier schedules, heavier obligations, and longer days. Our typical summer slump has his us this past month, as our offerings were far less than expenses in August by \$2,876 and overall we are in the hole by \$18,379 for the year. The only items we paid for this month that were not on the Must Pay list were for our Mission Offering to the Synod (\$765) maintenance and cleaning supplies (\$75), Meditations (\$56) and Hymnal Accompaniment (\$57). The net result is a decrease to our operating account, now at \$9,703. This is well below the \$15,000 needed to pay our normal must fund bills. This also means we are continuing to use up the \$12,000 we borrowed from our capital


