For books with a known DRA level, it is listed on the left. Some of the DRA levels were drawn by converting from another leveling system. These are listed in the same way. All numbers in **BOLD** indicate an estimated DRA based on grade-level suggestions. Most books labeled **UPPER** are books originally written for grown-ups.

FAQs

What is the DRA? The Diagnostic Reading Assessment is a test to identify student reading level. Grammar students at The Academy are assessed at the beginning and end of each school year. The results are used to help teachers and parents choose appropriate reading material and to identify learning needs.

What should my child's DRA level be? All students will progress in their reading ability at a different pace, but in general, we hope for students to reach particular milestones at each grade level. Ask your child's teacher for his/her DRA level.

Entering 1st Grade: 4-6

Entering 5th Grade: 50

Entering 2nd Grade: DRA 18-20

Entering 6th Grade: 60

Entering 3rd Grade: DRA 28-30

Entering 7th Grade: 70

Entering 4th Grade: 40

How should I choose books for my child? For optimal growth, students should be reading at and slightly above their DRA level. This helps them grow in their ability without growing frustrated. It is fine for students to read far above their DRA level if they are particularly excited about a book or topic. It is also fine for students to occasionally read below their DRA level as this gives them a sense of accomplishment and builds fluency.

What if my child struggles to read the Literature selections in class? Many of the Literature books on The Academy Book List are above suggested reading level for that grade, but we have chosen these classic and quality books because they relate to the rest of the curriculum and help shape students' affections for the True, Good, and Beautiful. Teachers will often read these aloud in class, and parents are encouraged to read aloud to their students if needed. For personal reading, parents can choose books from this list for students to read and grow in their reading skills.
