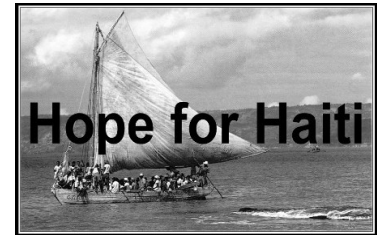


December 3rd, 2012 Newsletter

- Do you call a group of goats a herd? Well Colmini Church/School now has 30 not counting many others that have been donated/purchased/delivered to children and families in the area
- A recent donation for 2 cows at Charrette Church/School
- 5 additional cows to be purchased for Bataille Church/School Dec or Jan

- Plants, seeds, starts donated to Fond Baptist Church/School. Enough to provide food and extra to sell. Potato harvest started last month.
- Approximately 2 years ago a school was opened at Bataille with a small amount of children, as of today 160 children are attending in this remote location
- English speaking class starts Monday at Marcel's
- Weekly Bible Studies
- Classrooms at Bois Neuf above stage completed
