## 5 Simple Ways You Can Make This Lesson Stick With your Kids

### Rahab - The shield

#### IN THE CAR:

Ask your child what they learned about this week on the drive home:

The spies Joshua had sent to Jericho were found out and in danger of being killed; but Rahab protected them and kept them safe. God used Rahab to protect them. Heroes look for those who need help and help them. Joshua 2:2-16, Rahab and the Spies

#### HANGING OUT:

Make this week's lesson real:

Do some spontaneous things to help others, without being asked, as a family. Donate to money collections. Take a meal to someone who needs it. Do a task that needs doing for someone who can't do it on their own.

#### AT DINNER:

Here are some great discussion starters:

- How did Rahab become a shield for the two spies?
- Why is it important for us to be alert and look for ways to help people?
- Is there anything we can do, as a family, to help someone you know?

#### AT BEDTIME:

Quiz your child on this summer's memory verse:

"Psalm 118:14 "The LORD makes me powerful and strong; he has saved me." (GNT)

#### PARENT TIME:

What you need to know:
