5 Simple Ways You Can Make This Lesson Stick With your Kids

Lydia - The Believer

IN THE CAR:

Ask your child what they learned about this week on the drive home:

When Paul preached to a group of women, Lydia became a believer in Jesus on the spot. One of the most heroic things that any of us can do is admit that we are not heroes by ourselves, but that we are sinners who need Jesus as our Saviour. Acts 16:11-15, Lydia's Conversion

HANGING OUT:

Make this week's lesson real:

Do you remember when you received Jesus as your Saviour? Share that story with your kids. Or ask your kids to teach you the story of Lydia and why she received the good news of Jesus with gladness.

AT DINNER:

Here are some great discussion starters:

- Who was Lydia?
- What did Lydia do when she learned about Jesus?
- Why do we need Jesus to be our hero?

AT BEDTIME:

Quiz your child on this summer's memory verse:

"Psalm 118:14 "The LORD makes me powerful and strong; he has saved me." (GNT)

PARENT TIME:

What you need to know:

We cannot save ourselves from sin, and we cannot earn our way to Heaven. Only by receiving Jesus as our Saviour can we be saved. Thank God this week for the gift of Jesus, and pray that all of our kids will accept the gift of Jesus!
