1. Can you think of a sacrifice, small or great, that someone did for you that has left a major impression on you? Tell us about it.

2. The sacrifices described in the book of Leviticus and Numbers are not necessarily scheduled sacrifices. You could bring a sacrifice for various purposes. Many sacrifices did follow a schedule – offerings were brought daily (AM and PM), monthly, accompanying different feasts and more. How do you think the sheer repetitiveness of the offerings could have affected the Israelites' view of God?

3. How does this repetitiveness of offering sacrifices contrast with the sacrifice of Jesus? Check out Hebrews 7:27 and 9:26-28.

4. In verses 1:5 and 3:8, we see the regulation to splash the blood of the sacrifice against the altar. When was the last time that they were commanded to cover something in blood? How is the effect similar here?

5. Read Ephesians 5:1-2. How does this verse tie together things we've been learning so far about Leviticus? List them below.

6. Do you think Leviticus is a better book to read with someone who is struggling with feeling like God would never want anything to do with them because of their sin, or more with someone who feels like they're already pretty good the way they are? Why?

7. What is one area where you might be feeling challenged to increase God's first-ness?
