This week's passage: Leviticus 12-15

1. Can you think of a time when something had too many rules or too many detailed requirements prompting you to lose interest or walk away?
2. Leviticus can be exhausting with all of its rules and regulations continually communicating how difficult – impossible – it is to be in God's presence without defiling it. List one reason it is important to press on and study it.
3. What comes across to you as most surprising in Leviticus 12-15?
4. According to Leviticus 15:31, how could uncleanness lead to death? Why?
5. Read Revelation 21:22-27. How does Jesus guarantee that we will never have to worry about the warning in Leviticus 15:31 in the New Earth?
6. One of the causes of uncleanness was disease in the garments. In the Message to the Church of Sardis (Revelation 3:1-6), how were some in the church soiling (diseasing) their garments? How does this teach us about uncleanness in Christ's Church today?

7. In the above case (Revelation 3:1-6) Jesus uses polluted garments as an analogy of personal sin. But in Leviticus 13:47-59 the garment's disease is not a result of personal sin. What is an example of something that is true of our fallen, cursed world that is not necessarily tied to personal sin?
