Extreme tour is a music and extreme sport festival that God has put on my heart to bring to Fairmont for a 3rd year. This year they will be here in Fairmont, July 5-7th. Once again our amazing church family is hosting them. The event will be at Sylvania Park on Wednesday, July 7th, with Search and Rescue (going out into the community parks and hangouts and striking up conversations with people and sharing the good news of Jesus) on July 5th and 6th. This is not your average music festival. These artists are sent on a mission from God to go to hundreds of communities a year, worldwide, to share the love of God with the lost

and overlooked, and the rejected people of our communities. I have personally seen families restored and addictions broken right here in our community because of Extreme Tour's ministry.

I have a shirt that I wear made by my friend Damon, who I met 3 years ago, on the first extreme tour. He had shirts and wristbands that said "Social Outcast," so I asked him what it means. He told me to look up Luke 19:10. It says this, "For the Son of Man came to seek and save those who are lost." That verse alone tells the story of the heart of Extreme Tour's ministry. Here is what Extreme Tour is in their own words.

Good day and God's blessings from the leadership of our church family. To better keep you all in the loop on some of the decisions made by the council, we would like to provide you with an update on some of the things going on.

In June of last year, the council in direction from the State of Minnesota, to re-gather the church safely during the pandemic, instituted a Strategic Regathering Plan. We realize this past year has been hard on many people and we are happy to report that there has been no COVID spread in our church family, that we know of, as

a result of our re-gathering for worship. Thank you to everyone for your patience and care for each other. As the numbers have fallen in our state and the withdrawal of restrictions from our state government, the church council voted in June to fully open and remove any restrictions still in our place. We pray that we will never need them again.

The council is also in the process of reviewing estimates for replacing all the concrete sidewalk along the front of the church. The concrete has been deteriorating and in need of replacement. We are hoping to have this

work done by the end of the summer or early fall before the snow starts to fly again.

Lastly, as Pastor Dan mentioned in his column last month, the council has decided to focus on building our church family by focusing on small groups. We believe that strong small groups make for a strong and growing church family. Look for more info in the coming months.
