



We are making progress! The Transition Committee has been considering the challenges Zion is facing at this time, and in this place. They have sought and received input from you, and were about to ask again – because your thoughts are important.

But to move the process along, we have chosen to create the Call Committee. These are the people who will help handle the call process, examine the proposed candidates, and bring to you a selection for you to consider and to call. This is a long process, and requires that we interact with the District Office.

The District needs your input, to start this work. Rather than asking you to do the same thing twice (once through the Transition Committee and one through the District Office), we prefer to let the District process begin. The Transition Committee will still have work to do to complete the process of moving Zion forward, and getting us ready to receive the new pastor once he is called and has accepted.

The District want each congregation calling a pastor to have its members fill out a Pastoral Profile Survey. This will help the District President and his assistants to select people who would fit the needs and wished of our congregation.

Elsewhere in this Newsletter, you'll find the link to the survey, which you could type into a computer, plus a QR-code you could use to access the survey on a smartphone. We are also including a paper copy, which you may want to review before going online to complete the survey, or for those of you who don't use computers – since your opinions and thoughts also matter. More paper copies can be obtained at the church, as needed – but it would be a lot less work for us if you can use either the computer or a smart phone.

The District knows that not everyone in the Congregation will answer the survey. But if we can get more people to fill this out, the results will better reflect the reality of our congregation, and our thoughts on what kind of Pastor Zion needs.

Please help us with this process. The survey will be open from Sunday, November 12, until the end of the month. The District Office will compile the results and let us know what you think. From there, the work of building our call list will begin.





Pastoral Profile Survey

- 3. Scan the QR code (pictured) with your smart phone and access the survey there.
- 4. Fill out a paper survey (included in your newsletter) and return to the church office. This will then be transferred to the district electronically.





Twenty-five families were in attendance. President Laura Hollingsworth open the meeting at 10:38 am giving time to review the minutes printed with the agenda. Moved and supported to accept minutes as printed.

Pastor Warsinski offered prayer.

God's Helping Hands started on August 25, 2018. We recently celebrated our 5-year anniversary. During that time, here are some of our accomplishments:

Approximately 300,000 lbs. of food was given away \$50,711.93 was spent on discounted food from the Food Bank of Eastern Michigan 163,150 diapers given away (we give away 6,000 diapers a month) Approximately 51,000 articles of clothing were given away Approximately 18,000 household items were given away Each time we are open, we on average help 68 families and 210 people We had a high of 200 families and 600 people helped during one of our drive-through food truck giveaways.
