



Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ.

As your Intentional Interim Minister, it's my job to help prepare Zion to receive their new, permanent, full-time Pastor. I am not eligible for this full time position, and we are going to be looking for someone better suited to the needs of the congregation.

To this end, we have formed a Transition Committee. The Committee will be looking at how we got where we are as a congregation, and considering what changes (if any) we need to make in the process, and will help us aim the congregation in the direction it probably should be going.

This is needed, because often, after a long term pastorate, such as Pastor Hauser's time at Zion, a congregation isn't ready to move on with someone new. It has been the general experience in Synod that the next pastor is

likely to be in a congregation for only a short time before leaving. Since this is not usually in the best interest of the congregations or pastors, the Intentional Interim Ministry has been developed, with the idea that the Intentional Interim Pastor can be this "short term" person, and work with the congregation, so that the next full-time pastor can be a long term shepherd for this portion of God's flock.

The process of this Committee will be to look at congregational (and individual) history, to see "what happened" and "why". Then they will examine our current congregational identity, especially anything that is new and different. The third part of the process examines congregational leadership, especially with regard to our identity. Part 4 will be looking at our links to the District and Synod, and examining our connections to our family of faith. The last part of the work will be to try to get everyone onboard and committed to a future direction in our ministry here.

It's important to go through this process so we know what we need to look for in our next pastor, what skills and talents he might need, and who among our choices best fits our plan for the congregation's future.

While I am helping to direct the process, I will not be directing the outcome – the committee will be making the decisions and recommendations, and these will come before the congregation, since in our tradition, the Congregation has the final say. Our goal is to be above board and transparent, with ears open to concerns and potential problems, so the whole congregation will be involved.

This is not a process that can be rushed, but it should not get bogged down, either. We want to move on to calling the next pastor as soon as we can, but not before we know what we are likely to need in a pastor, so that the pastor and congregation can both prosper as they work together in God's Kingdom.

While my hours here at Zion a limited, I expect to serve on Sunday mornings (and other worship services as needed), to visit the sick and shut-ins, and do other work for the good of the congregation, as God grants me time.

Please pray for this whole process here at Zion, pray for (and talk to) the Committee, and pray also for me – that God would bless our time together, and soon send His choice for the next Under-shepherd of the flock here at Zion.

Trustees Update May 8, 2023

Church roofs replacement.

We have been working on finding a contractor to give us a quote on new roof on the Narthex. Hardwood Hills (the contractor for the Fellowship Hall) brought an architect to determine what needs be done.

The scope of replacing the roof over the Narthex and the porch has been changed. Upon inspection of all the roofs we have decided to get bids on replacement of the Narthex and Porch, the Sanctuary and the Old Office roofs. We have received bids from Kawkawlin Roofing, Bri-Car Roofing and Beyer Roofing. We are reviewing those bids and will try to select a bid by 5/19. We will also determine if we need to do them all at once or can spread them over 2-3 years.

The ages of the roofs are: Narthex/Porch (21 yrs), Sanctuary (29 yrs), Old Office (???)

We also had these contractors look at the condition of the Fellowship Hall roof (14 years old). It was decided that it did not need to be replaced. There was however, some curling of the membrane along the west edge of the roof. As this roof is still under warranty, we will contact the installer to get this repaired. The installer has inspected and will contact the warranty company and get back with us.

Moisture problem in east wall of Sanctuary

There is a white power material (efflorescence) on the east wall which indicates that moisture is coming through the bricks from the outside. We are looking into the cost of sealing the entire exterior brick to address this problem and prevent similar problems with our brick. We looked at doing this in 2008 but it was not done.

Replacing the Carillon (installed in 1957)

The existing carillon has failed so we are looking at what systems are available and their costs. We have one supplier, of carillon systems, scheduled to visit the church and give us a estimate. We will also be getting estimates from two additional suppliers.

Leaking Boiler Water

We had another leak show up in the school hot water heating system. The radiator in the old Teacher's bathroom, for those of you remember that, began to leak. Piper HVAC repaired it on 5/2. They also repaired two leaking faucets in the kitchen

Noise in pastor's wireless microphone

We have been experiencing noisy interference, during the worship service, in the wireless microphone system. This is due to the frequency range used by the system was sold to T-Mobile and at times their use this range can interfere with pastor's wireless microphone. To solve this problem, we need to replace our wireless systems, so we have ordered new units which operate in a different frequency range. Unfortunately, they will not be delivered until October!



Bell Tower roof leak

Some mold was noticed on the drywall in the bell tower room next to organ. This was traced to a leak from the Bell Tower roof. The trustees will be working on fixing this.
