

5 Simple Ways You Can Make This Lesson Stick With Your Kids

THIS WEEK'S LESSON: TELLING CAMPFIRE STORIES



IN THE CAR:

Ask your child what they learned about this week on the drive home: It's nice to sit around the campfire and tell each other stories. Kids will learn that we have the best story ever to tell: Jesus is alive! Luke 24:13-32, On the Road to Emmaus.



M HANGING OUT:

Make this week's lesson real:

Share some bedtime stories with the kids one night, and be sure and read from the Bible when you do. Ask the kids how they would retell the Jesus story.



AT DINNER:

Here are some great discussion starters:

- What did the two men on the road to Emmaus talk about with Jesus?
- What is the happy ending to the story of Jesus?
- Why do we need to tell others about Jesus?



AT BEDTIME:

Quiz your child on this week's memory verse:

"God began a good work in you. And I am sure that he will carry it on until it is completed. That will be on the day Christ Jesus returns." - Philippians 1:6 (NIRV)



PARENT TIME:

What you need to know:

It's important for us not only to know the story of Jesus; we need to know how to retell it. Pray that God will help your children understand the gospel so they can share it with others.
