

5 Simple Ways You Can Make This Lesson Stick With Your Kids

THIS WEEK'S LESSON: ALL THAT HISTORY!



IN THE CAR:

Ask your child what they learned about this week on the drive home:

The books of history tell us what happened to God's people when they inherited the Promised Land and what happened when they forgot about God. They teach us about God's laws and God's forgiveness. Joshua 24:14-22, Joshua's Charge to the People



THANGING OUT:

Make this week's lesson real:

Ask the kids to teach you the hand motions they learned to help them remember the history books of the Bible. See if they can remember all of the books from the beginning.



AT DINNER:

Here are some great discussion starters:

- What stories are in the history books?
- What are the 12 books of history?
- What do these books tell us about obeying God?



AT BEDTIME:

Quiz your child on this week's memory verse:

"God has breathed life into all Scripture. It is useful for teaching us what is true. It is useful for correcting our mistakes. It is useful for making our lives whole again. It is useful for training us to do what is right." 2 Timothy 3:16 (NIrV)



TO PARENT TIME:

What you need to know:

The history books continue the stories begun in the first five. They teach us what happens when we disobey God, but they also teach us that God forgives. Read a few stories from the histories this week with your kids, like Gideon, David and Goliath, Ruth, or Esther.
