## THE HINGE OF HISTORY





In world history, as in our individual personal histories, all moments are not created equal. Some moments are of greater significance or consequence.

Since preparing to teach on “Mary’s Song” recently, a thought from an article I read during my research stuck in my spirit: “Mary sees clearly a most remarkable thing about God: He is about to change the course of all human history; the most important three decades in all of time are about to begin.”

I pondered this idea and remembered Bro. T. L. Craft saying that “eternity’s doors swing on little hinges.” I did an Internet search for the phrase “hinges of history” and found a treasure trove of fascinating information.

The “hinge of history” refers to crucial turning points or periods of time when choices and events have a disproportionately large, long-term impact on the world, shaping humanity’s future.

I ran across several books on this theme, including a series written by Thomas Cahill titled “The Hinges of History.” The books explore pivotal moments in Western culture. The titles and summaries are intriguing to say the least.

In my studies on the life of Jesus Christ, I noticed that the phrase “from that time” occurs three times in the book of Matthew, indicating turning points—or hinges—in the ministry of Jesus.

The first occurs after the baptism and temptations of Jesus when His public ministry began: “From that time Jesus began to preach, and to say, Repent: for the kingdom of heaven is at hand” (Matthew 4:17).

The second occurs when the tide of public opinion turned against Jesus. He prophesied His death and focused more intensely on training the Twelve: “From that time forth began Jesus to shew unto his disciples, how that he must go unto Jerusalem, and suffer many things of the elders and chief priests and scribes, and be killed, and be raised again the third day” (Matthew 16:21).

The third occurs when Judas determined to betray Jesus, indicating the beginning of the end: “And from that time he sought opportunity to betray him” (Matthew 26:16).

These three passages describe hinges, significant changes in the public ministry of Jesus.

We can apply the phrase “from that time” to assert that, from a world history perspective, the life of Jesus Christ stands as the most pivotal period of all time. He was THE hinge of history.

The recognition of the significance of the life of Jesus Christ is reflected in our calendar. The Gregorian calendar, which marks time by the birth of Christ, is the most widely used calendar in the Western world. BC stands for “before Christ” as recorded history counts down to Jesus’ birth. AD stands for the Latin phrase “Anno Domini,” which means “the year of our Lord.” It refers to the year that Jesus Christ was born. (The early calendars miscalculated the birth of Jesus by a few years, but the intention is the same with the use of BC and AD in dating world history.) The Gregorian calendar was influenced by Christian thought, but is widely accepted and used, acknowledging the birth of Jesus Christ as the hinge of human history.

In your life, each day counts, but not all days are equal in consequence. It is important to savor significant moments that are hinges in your personal history. When a hinge moment comes, make sure you do not miss it. Time passes swiftly, and days blur into years. Soon, we reach the twilight years of our lives and then pass away. Make sure you are wide awake and fully engaged when you are experiencing a hinge in your personal history. Your future, and the futures of others, may be determined by that moment, that hinge of history.

Finally, in the life of a church, there are hinges of history. In the nearly 65-year history of our local church, there have been significant moments for our church. We are blessed that our founders and subsequent members walked with God and sought His guidance as they navigated our church’s history. Our church has been shaped by those significant hinge moments.

And now, Atlanta West Pentecostal Church is at another hinge of history. Moving into a new Sanctuary is monumental. We are at a moment of destiny. This hinge of history is connected to the blessing of our new facilities. This place is a gift from God to fulfill His mission. However, we must never forget that we are stewards of this moment. This is not a time for complacency or church as usual.

This hinge of history for our church is a crucial time when our level of commitment and the choices we make will have a significant, long-term impact that will shape our church’s future.

As we begin a new year, please join me in making fresh consecrations to the message and mission of the church. Let us make the most of this hinge of history. The future is counting on us.
