

INTRODUCTION

Romans 8:37 says, "We are more than conquerors." Do you believe this in every situation of your life? If so, what does this mean to you? If not, what do you think is preventing you from seeing yourself the way God sees you? Are there specific situations in which it is more difficult to believe this than others? Why do you think this is? Read **Romans 8:35-39**.

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

- 1. This week we talked a lot about identity. Name a movie character or famous actor that you are most like.
- 2. What does it mean to be a conqueror? What do you think of when you hear the word conqueror?
- 3. Have you ever thought of yourself as a prince or princess in Christ? If not, is there something else you think of that helps you remember yourself as a child of God? How do you think God defines you as his child?
- 4. Have you ever seen pride or false humility displayed in someone you know? What did that look like? What was the result of this person displaying pride or false humility? Have *you* ever displayed pride or false humility?
- 5. Have you ever felt like you've been stuck in a pit and can't get out? What did you do in that situation? What is your response knowing that Jesus has overcome it for you and he has been through similar things?

MOVING FORWARD

"You are not defined by what others have done to you. You are defined by what Christ has done for you." If God is for us, who can be against us? Is this something you are convinced of? Do you believe God is for you everyday in every way? Have you ever thought about a love that no amount of suffering can defeat, even death itself? If so, how is that expressed by the way you live your life? Spend some time reflecting this week on your identity. Who or what do you let define you? If it is not God, spend some time thinking about what you need to do in your life to take the next step to becoming a conqueror.
