God's work. Our hands ... were busy

A lot of activity happened last weekend during the "God's work. Our hands." Sunday. Our stats are stated below. We can all be proud of RLC's contributions within our church, our region, and our world.

Aluminum: 130 pounds of aluminum plus 339 pounds of scrap metal added an extra \$119 in the AOF fund.

Blood: 15 units were donated at the blood drive, including two units from first-time donors!

Care Team: made goodie bags and deliver to a dozen of our homebound members.

Letters Against Isolation: 42 letters were written for seniors in nursing homes and Meals on Wheels recipients.

Litter: 10 heavy bags of trash plus a decent collection of recyclables were removed from the sites in the neighborhood.

Lovepacs boxes: 35 boxes used by Lovepacs for food deliveries were decorated by members of all ages.

Lovepacs donations: 220 boxes of mac & cheese, 140 cans of tuna and 10 cans of chicken were given to Lovepacs Plano.

Pet beds: 9 beds were donated to the Plano Animal Shelter.

Potluck: over 70 people enjoyed the bountiful potluck.

Special thanks to the crews who set up, washed dishes, and cleaned up afterwards.

Quilts: 10 kid's quilts were tied and three more started.

Additionally, we blessed 204 quilts during the worship service made by the talented Cover Girls that will be distributed around the world through Lutheran World Relief.

Narrative Lectionary Resumes today

The Narrative Lectionary, developed at Luther Seminar in St. Paul, is a chronological approach to studying scripture beginning with Genesis and progressing sequentially through the old and new testaments. The class meets in the Library each Sunday about 11:15. The format is an interactive, participatory discussion led by a facilitator using the reading, commentary and additional insights from scholarly sources such as the texts used in the Synod's Parish Lay Ministry Academy (PLMA). Everyone is invited and encouraged to participate in the discussion or simply listen, if they choose. Preparation is not required. (Although it will enhance your experience.)
