Pastor Bill's Page



We have walked the Lenten road together. We began with ashes and the solemn reminder that we are dust, and to dust we shall return. We walked through days of repentance, self-examination, prayer, and renewed dependence upon the mercy of God. We followed our Lord in His suffering and His cross, reflecting again on the great cost of our redemption.

And now, by God's grace, we have come to Easter. We have reached the joyful destination toward which Lent was always pointing: the empty tomb, the risen Christ, the triumph of life over death, forgiveness over sin, and hope over despair. The alleluias that were set aside have returned. The Church's song has changed. The sorrow of Good Friday has given way to the joy of resurrection morning.

Christ is risen! He is risen indeed! Alleluia! And yet, even as we rejoice, we know this is not the end of the journey. Easter is a destination, yes—but it is also a beginning.

The resurrection of Jesus is not only something we celebrate; it is the living reality that now shapes every step of our lives. Because Christ is risen, we do not simply look back on His victory with gratitude. We now walk forward in light of it. We live as people whose future has already been secured, even while we still travel through a world marked by sorrow, struggle, and death.

That is the strange and beautiful tension of the Christian life. We have reached Easter joy, but we still wait for Easter's final fullness. We have heard the good news of the risen Lord, but we still live in a fallen world. We have been given new life in Christ, but we still await the day when even our bodies will be raised and made new. In other words, the journey continues.

The season of Lent taught us again that the Christian life is one of repentance and faith. Easter teaches us that the Christian life is also one of hope and confidence. We do not walk aimlessly. We do not wander without promise. We do not move toward an uncertain end. We are headed toward the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. We are headed toward the day when faith becomes sight. We are headed toward the final destination: everlasting life with Christ.

The risen Jesus whom the disciples saw on Easter morning is the same Jesus who now reigns in glory, who speaks through His Word, who comes to us in His Sacraments, and who promises to come again. His resurrection is the guarantee that death does not get the last word. The grave is not our end. Suffering is not our final chapter. For all who belong to Christ, resurrection is not merely a metaphor or a wish. It is the sure promise of God.

This means that the whole of the Christian life is lived between Easter and the Last Day. And we are an Easter people still on the move.

We still face trials. We still endure grief. We still wrestle with temptation. We still carry crosses. But we do so now as those who know how the story ends. The tomb is empty. Christ lives. And because He lives, we too shall live.

So the journey continues in daily faithfulness. It continues as we gather for worship week after week. It continues as we hear again the promises of God. It continues as we care for our neighbors, bear one another's burdens, forgive as we have been forgiven, and live in the joy and freedom of the Gospel. It continues in the ordinary callings of home, work, school, and community. It continues through seasons of celebration and seasons of tears.

And through it all, the risen Christ goes with us. That may be the greatest comfort of all. We do not make this journey alone. The One who conquered death is not waiting only at the end of the road. He is with us now. He leads us, strengthens us, restores us, and keeps us in the true faith until the day when He brings us at last to Himself.

So let us rejoice in Easter with full hearts. Let us sing our alleluias with gladness. Let us give thanks that we have come again to this bright and holy feast.

And then let us keep walking. For the journey of this earthly life is not over yet. But it is no longer a journey overshadowed by fear. In Christ, it is a journey filled with promise. It is a road marked by grace. And it is leading, step by step, toward the day when we will stand in the presence of our risen Lord, and when He will raise us up to live with Him forever.

Until that day, we live in Easter hope. For Christ is risen, and that changes everything.

And we sing our thanks and praise for the next **7 Sundays of Easter!**

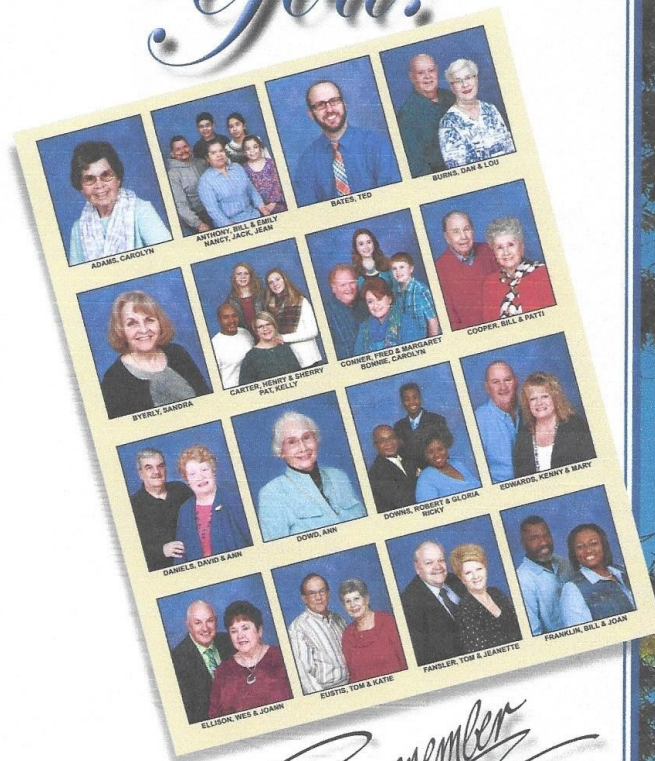

Earth Month aluminum collection will be postponed by a week.) When we exchange your cans and other scrap metals for cash, you contribute to our fund to cover unexpected maintenance issues. The war with Iran boosted the price of aluminum, so our March collection earned us \$73 with a record (for us) 95 cents per pound. (Average price last year was 77 cents/pound.) Recycling pays!

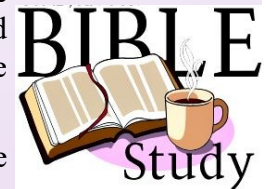

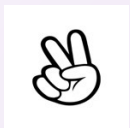
We're going back to Pharr! Our Mission Trip will be June 27th-July 3rd, and we will be teaming up with King of Glory. More details to come!

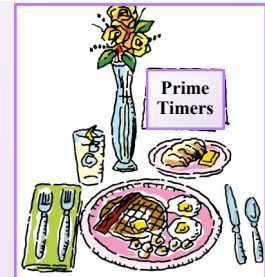

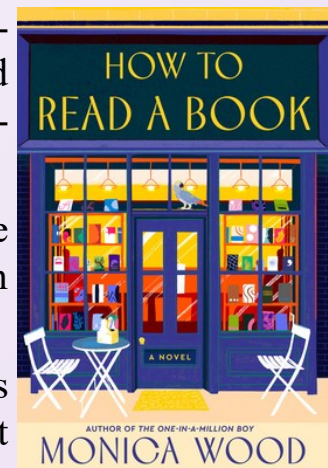

Harriet Larson, a retired English teacher who runs the prison book club, is facing the unsettling prospect of an empty nest.

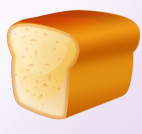
Frank Daigle, a retired machinist, hasn't yet come to grips with the complications of his marriage to the woman Violet killed.

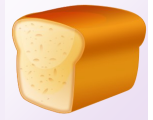

Note that aluminum cans are up to 95 cents a pound! I think that's the highest they've ever been. Steel (what they call tin) is now over 10 cents a pound, and that's as high as I've ever seen it. We had no copper this month, but brass is now nearly \$3 a pound. So the total this month was \$92.

And if you think that's good, wait 'til you see what I hope we get next month!!

Are you a benefit member of Thrivent? If so, we could use your help in applying to Thrivent for seed money for a number of service projects and fundraisers at Resurrection Lutheran.
