## Pastor Bill's Page



Every December, the calendar seems to accelerate. The parking lots fill, the schedules crowd, and the list of things we're convinced we *must* accomplish grows longer by the day. We rush from store to store, from event to event, from one obligation to the next. The season that proclaims "peace on earth" often leaves us with very little peace at all.

But if we lift our eyes from the noise of our modern American Christmas, we find ourselves face-to-face with a very different scene—the stillness of Bethlehem.

The birth of Christ did not take place under twinkling lights or in the glow of a department store display. It wasn't cushioned by wealth, comfort, or the hype of holiday advertising. It happened in the margins—quietly, almost unnoticed—among a people living under foreign rule, in conditions we might describe today as "third world." A crowded village. A borrowed stable. A young mother. A weary carpenter. No Instagram moments. No Black Friday sales. No countdown calendars.

Just God. Coming close. In the dark. For us.

The humility of Christ's birth is not an accidental detail; it is the very shape of God's love. The Savior enters our world not with spectacle but with self-giving. Not with fanfare but with faithfulness. Not with noise but with a newborn's cry.

And perhaps this is why the Christmas season feels so strained in our culture: our celebrations so often pull us toward what is temporary, while Christ's coming draws us toward what is eternal. We are tempted to measure the holiday by what we buy, decorate, bake, or schedule. Yet the manger measures Christmas in an entirely different way—not by our activity, but by God's grace.

This year, I invite you to step away—if only for a moment—from the frantic pace around us. Let the quiet of Bethlehem interrupt the noise. Let the humility of Christ re-center your heart. Let the wonder of His incarnation—God in the flesh, God for you—restore the peace the world cannot give.

May these gatherings give you space to step out of the commotion and step into the presence of the One who came to bring peace.

For in that small, still corner of a troubled land, the greatest gift was given. Not wrapped, but swaddled. Not placed under a tree, but laid in a manger. Not purchased, but promised.

May the Christ who entered our world in holy stillness enter your hearts with His everlasting peace.

## **Church Council**



#### Constitutionally Speaking

As I write this, the Nominating Committee is busily searching for candidates to fill the various elected positions on the Council. If you are asked to serve, consider it a compliment and an opportunity as it both.

What is the Nominating Committee and what does it do?

As outlined in the RLC Organizational Chart, the Nominating Committee reports directly to the Congregation. It consists of six members. Each member is chosen to serve a 3-year term. Every year 1/3 of the committee's membership (2 members) complete their terms and must be replaced. The staggered terms provide a measure of continuity within the committee from year to year.

The RLC Constitution, which creates the Nominating Committee and defines its purpose, organization and responsibilities, does not specify a chairperson. If the committee members choose, they may select a chairperson from among their membership or that responsibility may be, and often is, shared among several members. It may seem the lack of a constitutionally defined structure and hierarchy would be problematic, however, in my view, it works surprisingly well and has for many years.

The Constitution also specifies term limits. The term length and the number of consecutive terms that may be served is also specified and varies depending on the position. I mention this because the president and vice-president positions are one-year terms and are limited to two consecutive terms. I will complete my second consecutive one year term as Council President at the end of this calendar year. While I may serve in other elected positions I cannot serve as president again until 2027. However, I fully expect that this year will be my "Swan Song".

The Constitution does not limit the number of times an individual may serve in any one position if the consecutive term limit is not exceeded. In the course of our history, many members have served multiple times.

The Constitution is amended from time to time as it will be this year at the Annual meeting coming up on December 7, 2025. But that's another article.

#### Happy New Church Year to all of you!

Advent is upon us, the anticipation of the Word becoming flesh and dwelling with us in the incarnation of Jesus Christ. The season color is blue for hope as we await the fulfillment of God's promise—the white purity of Christ among us—Christmas.

Each week in Advent we light a candle, first of hope, then of peace, third is joy, and last is love. On Christmas Eve we light those four and the Christ candle, reminding us that Christ is the light and the darkness has not—and will not—overcome it. This year we are singing a song lyric written by Steve Peck, uncle of Ellen Frost. He writes songs for various occasions and sent this one to Ellen with permission for us to use in our worship.

This year we are adding a service called *Blue Christmas*. We come together to acknowledge that many of us are not yet joyous due to loss, painful memories, loneliness, darkness of any sort. We take the time to recognize our pain and to seek and find hope that it will pass. Join us Sunday, December 21st at 4:00 pm for the Blue Christmas Service. See invitation elsewhere in Butterflier.

December 24th, Christmas Eve we will have two worship services, the first at 3:00 pm (*note time change*) in the Chapel and the second at 7:00 pm in the Sanctuary. Both include Holy Communion and candle lighting.

There are two Christmas Sundays this year, December 28th and January 4th. Then the decorations come down and we move into and through the season of Epiphany—God made known through Jesus. Epiphany is January 6th and the Baptism of Jesus is January 11<sup>th</sup>. The color is white, but the Sundays following show the color green, as we hear again the good news that we are children of God and share the joyful work of God's love and justice though our ministries.

#### **Stephen Ministers**



At the 50 year Celebration of the establishment of Stephen Ministers held in the Oklahoma City area, it was encouraging to see over 200 participants from all religious groups gathered together in unity to address the continued need for support of "all God's children" as they face daily struggles. A big focus was on the gift of empathy. Empathy is something we all need --- and it's something we can all give. In the midst of life's challenges, it's both comforting and healing when someone takes the time to listen, feel our hurt, and show that they truly get it and care about what we're going through.

One sweet example from the book, The Gift of Empathy, goes like this:

"My wife and I, along with our two children, were driving from St. Louis to Atlanta. Three hours into the ten hour drive, our 4 year old daughter, Hope, suddenly remembered that her teddy bear, Dora, the teddy bear she cuddled with to sleep at night, had not been packed. My wife and I immediately started to think of ways to FIX the problem...could someone go get Dora and overnight ship the package to us, etc. But our 7 year old son, Luke, reached out to his sister, took her hand and said, "it's really sad not having Dora, I'm sad with you". Then he reached into his bag and pulled out his own stuffed bear, handed it to Hope, saying "Valentino is sorry you're missing Dora and he says he'll be your friend it you want." Hope hugged Valentino and he became her companion throughout the trip. How lucky Hope was to have a brother who could feel and understand the depth of her pain.

Surely if a child can do it, we can too! Most often people don't want us to FIX things for them, they just want validation, caring and empathy as they navigate their life's challenges.

He sends out a reminder for 3<sup>rd</sup> Saturday and sets times for TeamTrimmer. #### **Aluminum Brings Joy to the World**



In Rudolph the Red-Nosed Reindeer, Sam the Snowman sang, "Everyone wishes for silver and gold. How do you measure its worth? Just by the pleasure it gives here on Earth." But at RLC, the shiny metal that brings us pleasure is aluminum and measure it by cents per pound.

The October aluminum can collection was taken to the recycler on November 4th, Election Day notwithstanding. Current price for aluminum cans has fallen to \$.66/pound. However we bounced back from last month's record low with a monthly total of 129 pounds, which still netted us \$85. Not too bad! And remember, it all goes to the bottom line!!

Since October 2024, our members have dropped off 1,299 pounds of aluminum cans which has resulted in \$1,016 for the AOF fund to help pay for unexpected repairs, including those to our HVAC systems. THANK YOU for participating in this fundraiser that promotes stewardship of our environment and our church home! While you are making spirits bright during the holidays, salvage those aluminum cans and bring them to the west doors on **December** 7th and January 4th. We might also want your scrap metal – just talk to "Scrappy" Mark Waterman about other precious metals.

#### Attribution by Linda Moore


We're in for a special treat for our next women's book discussion. After reading <u>Attribution</u> by Linda Moore, we will be taking a field trip to the Meadows Museum at SMU for a docent-guided tour that connects the novel to the works on view in their galleries.

Our tour is scheduled for 10:00 am and there is a \$15 per person fee. We'll meet at the church and carpool and perhaps have lunch afterward.

Here's a summary of the book to whet the appetite!

Art historian Cate Adamson, desperate to succeed to console her grieving parents, leaves the Midwest to complete her doctorate in New York—only to find herself assigned to an impossible sexist advisor. She struggles to impress him until she discovers a hidden painting, possibly a Baroque masterpiece. Risking her career, financial disaster, and further alienation from her family, she flees to Spain with the painting to consult art experts.

Antonio, an impoverished duke, meets Cate on the train to Seville, and joins her search while attempting to rescue the decaying legacy of his family. They find clues and uncover evidence that will shock the titans of art history, may destroy her prospects as an art historian, and shatter her future with Antonio.




