OVERVIEW

The following reading plan, prepared by Stephen Witmer, and presented by the Gospel Coalition, is designed to take you through the Old Testament in two years, and through the Psalms and Proverbs four times during that period. This plan is based on the book *How to Read the Bible Book by Book* by Gordon Fee and Douglas Stuart. Both the 2002 and the 2014 edition have the same page numbers and can be followed in the third column of the book mark to the left. You will benefit the most from this reading plan if you use it together with the Fee/Stuart book.

HOW TO HAVE A QUALITY DEVOTIONAL TIME

A devotional time is a special time set aside for the specific purpose of connecting with God through his word and prayer.

1. Whether you choose to have your devotional time in the morning or at night, it is best to begin your experience in prayer. In his book, *When I Don't Desire God*, pastor and author John Piper gives an example of how he begins his devotional in prayer with the acronym I.O.U.S.:

- Incline my heart to your testimonies, not to selfish gain! (Ps 119:36)
- Open my eyes that I may behold wondrous things out of your law. (Ps. 119:18)
- Unite my heart to fear your name (Ps. 86:11)
- Satisfy me in the morning with your steadfast love, that I may rejoice and be glad in all my days (Ps. 90:14)

An unfortunate side effect of repeatedly praying the same prayer is that, over a period of time, it can lose its sense of pertinence. One way to keep it fresh is to unpack the content with language that expresses what you mean in a new way.

2. Read each passage daily, if possible. If a day or two is missed, there are two catch-up days allotted after each Bible book finished.

3. Journal and pray about the passages. Ask God to show you what it says about him, you, and Christ's glory. Write down struggles and questions you have or Scriptures that caught your eyes. End in prayer.

HOW TO HAVE A QUALITY DEVOTIONAL TIME

A devotional time is a special time set aside for the specific purpose of connecting with God through his word and prayer.

An unfortunate side effect of repeatedly praying the same prayer is that, over a period of time, it can lose its sense of pertinence. One way to keep it fresh is to unpack the content with language that expresses what you mean in a new way.

2. Read each passage daily, if possible. If a day or two is missed, there are two catch-up days allotted after each Bible book finished.

3. Journal and pray about the passages. Ask God to show you what it says about him, you, and Christ's glory. Write down struggles and questions you have or Scriptures that caught your eyes. End in prayer.

WHY TWO YEARS?

It should be the goal of every Christian to delight in God's Word (Psalm 1:2). However, even with good intentions, reading through the entire Bible in one year alone is a challenge for most people. With a two year plan you can read through the entire Bible at a pace that is manageable.

WHY HAVE SUPPLEMENT?

Though God's word is sufficient and authoritative for our lives and practice of faith (2 Timothy 3:16-17), the Bible doesn't neatly put together the pieces of the over-arching storyline of Scripture. Fee and Stuart's book is an easy to follow supplement that will help you navigate through all the parts of Scripture. Though this supplemental reading is not required for this reading plan, it will prove to be helpful resource for you and your understanding of Scripture.
