

Word, Water, & Wine: What Do We Believe?

Have you ever wondered why some church communities baptize people of all ages while others refuse to baptize infants and young children? Ever wonder what different churches believe about Holy Communion? If you have or are curious to learn more about these questions, join Pastor Matt in April for a two-session series



April 7 @10:00am - "Baptism: Drowning Death & Salvation" In this session we will dive into the biblical narrative in Mark, Acts, and Romans, wondering how the one Christian church ended up with diverging beliefs and practices.

April 14 @ 10:00am- "Holy Communion: Eating Jesus"

In this session we will discuss the three primary ways the Christian church understands this meal Jesus instituted on the night in which he was betrayed. We will do this by looking at the four books in the New Testament that testify to Jesus' words, Matthew, Mark, Luke, and 1 Corinthians.

From Pastor Matt

Every New Morning

rejoice and be glad in it."-Psalm 118:24
I'll admit, I am no longer a morning person. There was a time when my internal clock got me going at 4am to deliver the daily newspaper in my childhood hometown, but these days it takes "a couple cups of coffee" worth of time to get moving, at least. Maybe you know mornings like these, when trudging through the routines that prepare us for the day feel like a chore and sours the outlook for the day ahead. Another day of school. Another day at work. Another day of the same.

The snow falling on the morning I'm writing this (March 26th) had me in this place, as I settled into a comfortable spot in Walker to consider an Easter sermon. While looking over the readings for Easter Sunday, I read the familiar words written above from Psalm 118. I sat struck, feeling a little guilty, at this simple yet extraordinary gift we have from the LORD. This day. This one. Here and now, all something God has prepared and given to you, to me, and to the world. It might sound simple, but when we begin to recognize what is a part of this day, well, it is truly extraordinary. Martin Luther in his explanation to the first article of the Creed included food and drink, health and home, family and community, and all the sustains this body and life, as that which God "daily and richly provides" to you and me. Our faith tells us this ought to be enough to turn morning frowns upside down, to rejoice and be glad at the beginning of each day for being here.

We all know, however, that which is gift doesn't always produce the anticipated life-giving, positive outcome. In other words, we have great capacity to hurt one another, even the people we claim to love the most. Though we have enough food in the world to feed every person, people still go hungry, because of greed or other injustice. In the real world, the list of things Luther named that sustains this body and life can seem fleeting. But...

That is not all God is up to. It was early in the morning that first new day when the women headed to the tomb. (see Mark 16) When they arrived, the tomb was already empty, and they became the first witnesses to this promise of Easter – that in Christ, all things are being made new. No longer are we bound by what was or by that which has always been. If the dead don't stay dead, then where else might new life spring up for us, for our neighbors, and for our world?

In the light of the resurrection, then these promises of God take hold of us in a new and powerful way.

-"The steadfast love of the Lord never ceases; his mercies never come to an end; they are new every morning; great is your faithfulness."

Lamentations 3:22-23

-"And the one who was seated on the throne said, "See, I am making **all things new**." Rev 21:5a

Armed with these promises of God, we are invited to approach each new morning with gladness, even without the cup of coffee first. For while we will still encounter the effects of sin and brokenness amidst the life God gives us, we are no longer bound by them. Not today. Not tomorrow. Not ever again.

April Women of Hope Gather Bible SudyNotes from Pastor Dave

Scripture and Nature: Teachers of Faith *Food*

This is the final installment of the study Scripture and Nature. As I write this article we are nearing the end of Minnesota Food Share month, so the question of how and what we eat is especially relevant. Along with the questions of how and what the questions of who and when are equally important. Food production is one of the foremost places where our changing climate and weather patterns are felt on a very personal level.

Read Luke 14:7-14 Jesus reminds us that food is not just for the sustance of the body. Who we eat with and how we eat are important parts of the right use of food. Question 1 invites us to think more deeply about what makes a meal memorable. One of my most memorable meals was Spam fried with brown sugar. What made the meal memorable was not the

food but the grace and kindness with which the meal was offered to me, a complete stranger.

Read Exodus 16:1-31 This passage explains what our prayer, "give us this day our daily bread" means for ourselves and those with whom we share the productive capacity of creation. We are blessed to live in a country with an abundant food supply and many of us grew up with admonition to "clean our plates". Is it "hoarding" to have excess food stored in this country simply because we refuse to pay the transportation costs to move the food to a country without food or financial resources? If you were one of the Hebrews how would it feel to get your "daily bread" daily, and only daily?

Read Genesis 1:27-31 Have you ever eaten a totally plant based meal? What was it like? Would you do it again?

Read Genesis 9:1-11 and answer question 5.

Read Leviticus 19:9-10; Matthew 12:1-2 Question 6 in an interesting one to consider if you have time.

Read Isaiah 55:1-2 This passage brings us round to the twin right uses of food; nourishment and delight. The delight can be in what we are eating; texture, taste, smell, who we share the table with, memories, etc.

The questions in the section "Bless This Food" can round out the conversation about food and its place in our lives and in the life of the human community. In what way(s) could each meal become a "Communion Meal" drawing us closer to God and all of God's creation, humankind and "other-kind" alike?


