The Palm Sunday Path

"When he entered Jerusalem, the whole city was in turmoil, asking, 'Who is this?'"

Matthew 21:10

When Jesus rode into the city of Jerusalem on the back of donkey, surrounded by shouts of adulation, it signaled a sort of collision that had been playing out ever since he proclaimed, "The kingdom of heaven has come near!" In the triumphal entry into the city, the powers of the kingdom of God came face to face with powers of the world enthroned there. Jerusalem served as the political seat of power in Judea, just as the temple served as the spiritual center for the region, and this public parade would rouse the tidal wave of resistance that in only a few days would put him on the cross.

The same powers in this world push back against the kingdom we pray for in the Lord's Prayer, "Thy Kingdom Come... on earth as it is in heaven." This tension of kingdoms clashing plays out in the world around us, just as they work themselves out inside our own selves and in our very lives.

This upcoming season of Lent we will dive deeply into the Palm Sunday Path, specifically moments in the path Jesus walked from the palm parade, until the Via Dolorosa, meaning the way or path of suffering. At moments in his teaching, in his words, and in his actions, Jesus invites all who would follow him into the cosmic collision of kingdoms and ask, "which kingdom are you serving?" This question is pertinent in the season of Lent as we assume a penitential posture, examining our lives and offering confession to a God who will always be faithful. This question is also pertinent in *this* season as we see these powers colliding in the world

around us, in our own cities and streets, leaving our neighbors in the wake of all the tumult.

Amidst it all you, me, all of us are invited to look with fresh eyes of faith at all that is going on around us – violence in the streets in our state, global institutions of power ignoring the needs of the most vulnerable around the world, and folks who are increasingly apathetic and despairing. Then we are called to ask, how does our faith in Christ invite, compel, and sometimes drag us kicking and screaming to respond? Are we willing to be honest and confess our part? Can we muster the courage to

challenge our own opinions and perspectives with the call to love our neighbor? All of our neighbors? Will the promises of God in Christ and our hope in the kingdom we pray for move us?

In preparation for the season, I invite you to spend some time dwelling in the following texts that will serve as preaching texts for our worship life both on Wednesday evenings and Sunday Mornings.

Week 1: Luke 19:28-40 "The Path Jesus Walks"

Week 2: Mark 12:1-12 "The Cost of Walking"

Week 3: Luke 23:1-4, 13-15, 22-23

"Interpreting the Path"

Week 4: John 13:1-9, 33-35 "Widening the Path"

Week 5: Luke 23:39-43 "Walking the Path Together"

Women of Hope February Gather Study

Notes from Pastor Dave

Now let us pray

Session Two: *Praying with the body of the Earth*

If you've looked at this month's study you may feel like me, "This is a tough one". If not, then more power to you. So, what shall we do? It is easy to forget that we spend much of, most of, our lives living in a world of human creation. We live in houses, not caves. We travel on paved roads and concrete sidewalks, our feet seldom touching grass or soil. Traveling in metal, climate controlled canisters, impervious to the wind, the rain, the cold; nature being merely scenery beyond our windshield. We do not wait for the sunrise to experience light. We reach for the nearest electrical switch. In the midst of this, the author is inviting us to examine our own relationships with nature. She uses prayer as a way to foster a deeper connection with God and the created order.

Have you ever been caught up in what is often called "a natural disaster"? What did that feel like? What were your prayers in the midst of the experience?

PRAYING AMONG THE TREES. *Are there particular trees you remember? For instance I remember a small tree in our yard that taught me I could not fly like Peter Pan no matter how often I jumped from it. Why do you remember your tree? What was your connection to it? If you were to pray for that tree, what would you say? If you were to praise that tree, what would you say?*

Read Psalm 1 *How does the image of a tree convey the psalmist's message?*

PRAYING ALONG RIVERS In the Bible "living water" refers to water that is moving, such as a river, creek, stream, etc. *Why do you think moving water is such a common image in the Bible?*

Read Revelation 22:1-5 *What do you notice about the "river of the water of life"? Could human activity have an impact on the river's ability to be "river of life"*

Read Revelation 22:17 *What do you think of this image of the end time? How can our prayers and our actions join with God to ensure a world where anyone who is thirsty can take a safe drink?*

I'll close with these words from that great nature hymn:

*Joy to the Earth! The Savior reigns
Let men their songs employ
While fields and floods, rocks, hills, and plains
Repeat the sounding joy Repeat the sounding joy
Repeat, repeat the sounding joy*
