A Primer in Matthew's Gospel

Mathew's Gospel begins by connecting Jesus' lineage back to Abraham, and ends with the promise of connection with us, even unto the end of the age. 

## From Pastor Matt

## Everyday Faith: Dying & Rising in Christ

What then is the significance of such a baptism with water?

It signifies that the old person in us with all sins and evil desires is to be drowned through daily sorrow for sin and repentance, and that daily a new person is to come forth and rise up to live before God in righteousness and purity forever.

(from the contemporary translation of Luther's Small Catechism, by Timothy Wengert; Augsburg Fortress Press. 1996)

Daily Dying: If we are honest, many of our yesterday's bear witness to our hesitation or outright refusal to love our neighbors as ourselves. We are too tired. We have our own responsibilities and desires. Others haven't loved us, so why should we love them? Our Lutheran Christian understanding of a daily dying and rising in Christ is a beautiful lens through which we can confess, "I could've served you better yesterday, God," and to see the next day as a new opportunity to let our light shine- without the baggage of our yesterdays.

Daily Rising in Everyday Ways: Living into this way of understanding a life of faith, recognizes the prospect that each morning we might rise up in countless ways to "live before God in righteousness." Patience with children in morning tasks, a phone call or text message to a friend wishing them a blessed, joy-filled, or restful day, or engaging with coworkers, a spouse, or anyone who happens to be a neighbor with a Christ-like spirit, are all simple ways we might embody the faith we cling to in this life. These countless everyday encounters are not to be overlooked as our rising up to be the hands and feet of Jesus.

Daily Rising in Planned Ways: There are other more public ways we might individually or collectively live into this baptismal calling. Some have chosen to advocate for the least of our neighbors by contacting legislators, accompanying them to appointments, or standing in solidarity with them, just as Jesus did. Some have offered their time to assist others in attending weekly worship or other community events. Some have decried the abuses of power that have always existed in this world through their writing, peaceful protest, or leadership in the church.

Daily Rising in Times of Need: Among the myriads of daily occasions to serve our neighbors in love, there are often flashpoints that spark quickly and require a response from someone, lest the cries of neighbors go unanswered. One example of the way the people of Hope have responded to this urgent need has been our new partnership with Habitat for Humanity. In a period of two months, a couple dozen volunteers, spearheaded by Pastor Dave and the Board of Outreach, have finished exterior construction, painted, and cleaned inside and outside homes in Cass Lake. Two homes are now buttoned up thanks to all this ministry work, but more importantly, two families will soon move into a safe and secure house, making it their home.

Daily Dying and Rising in Times of Need:

Another flashpoint looms large as we tip into November, and I believe this will give us another opportunity to let go of the old and rise up anew to meet the cries of our neighbors with love. It was already expected that food insecurity would rise in our area entering this winter. Hope's meal ministry, frozen prepared meals anyone can deliver to neighbors who could use them, has seen a noticeable increase in activity. Hope has received notice from both Cass County Health and Human Services and the Walker Area Food Shelf, anticipating a big and potentially sudden increase in need because of the continuing federal government shutdown. Now, regardless of where we fall on the politics of this, the reality is that some of our neighbors who work for the Federal Government may not receive paychecks and many of our neighbors who rely on nutrition programs like SNAP may not receive assistance. In times like these we can join the politicians and argue about the same principles, philosophies, and policies we hold, or we can let that die for a moment and help feed hungry people. As a member of Hope just told me the other day, "when I'm putting away groceries and my pantry is full, it is time to give some it away."

#### What Can We Do?

†The first two weeks of November the Walker Area Food Shelf has invited us to do a Butter Drive. Bring it to the church and we'll deliver it.

**†**Consider supporting Hope's Christmas Food Box Ministry with your time or financial gifts.

†Hold your neighbors in prayer, and then be moved by the Spirit to donate non-perishables to the local food shelf.

†Signup to volunteer at the Walker Area Food Shelf in the upcoming months. It is a terrific way to serve and to witness the need in our area.

†Discuss with your household offering a special gift to your area food shelf around Thanksgiving as a way to offer your thanks to God. Remember, through the Second Harvest Food Bank area food shelves can leverage donations to purchase in bulk.

†Hold a food drive with your neighborhood, a service organization, or extracurricular team.



### **Suicide Prevention**

Suicide can be prevented, and the Suicide and Crisis Lifeline has mental health professionals assisting people who are struggling or in a crisis. They can be reached by texting or calling 988 or 988chatlifeline.org.

Risk of suicide is greater if a behavior is new or has increased, and it seems related to a painful event, loss, or change.

According to Kelly Felton, State of Minnesota Suicide Crisis Coordinator.

\*Talking about or making plans for suicide.

\*Acting anxious or agitated, behaving recklessly

\*Talking about being a burden to others.

\*Talking of being trapped or in unbearable pain. \*Increasing the use of alcohol or drugs.

\*Talking of feeling hopeless or having no reason to live.

\*Sleeping too much or too little.

\*Withdrawing or feeling isolated


\*Showing rage or talking about seeking revenge.

\*Displaying extreme mood swings.

## Money, Stewardship and Generosity

Session Two

Stewardship: How Do We Tend Our Treasure?

Our study begins with a question, "What does 'stewardship' mean to you?". Think about this question before you conside the author's definition.

Before you read Genesis 2:15, read Genesis 2:5. We humans have a crucial role to play in the flourishing of creation: a role not just for our own benefit but for the benefit of all creatures. The author makes a point worth repeating often: "dominion" is not to be confused with domination. Biblically "dominion" means to treat something or someone with the same love and care as God does. This is a tall order indeed.

Question 3 may make you think about our human interactions differently. Almost daily, each of us is in a position to add to another's well-being, even if it is just with a kind or supportive word. In the church, perhaps especially in the church, each of us has the opportunity, and the duty, to pass along our

ministry to those who will come after us. We also are to be constantly on the watch for the chance to help someone discover their gifts and to encourage them.

And now the tithe. I saw a cartoon once where a small boy is sitting in a restaurant booth with his father as the father is looking over the bill for their meal. The boy questions his father, "How come the waitress gets 15% and God only gets 10%?" Kids say the darndest things.

I'll leave you with this often repeated story about John Wesley, one of the leading founders of the Methodist denomination. In 1731

Wesley began to limit his expenses so he would have more money to give to the poor. He records that one year his income was £30, and his living expenses £28, so he had £2 to give away. The next year, his income doubled, but he still lived on £28 and gave £32 away. In the third year, his income jumped to £90; again he lived on £28, giving £62 away. The fourth year, he made £120, lived again on £28, and gave £92 to the poor. He was more concerned with his standard of giving than with his standard of living.

Finally read Luke 12:42-48 if you dare.
