## Day 2

Pray.

Read Genesis 22:14. Look up the meaning of *Jehovah Jireh* and record your findings here.

We most often think of God as our Provider in an everyday, general sense, i.e., He provides us with food, shelter, employment, etc. But what was Abram's need that day in Genesis 22?

According to Hebrews 11:17-19, what did Abram believe regarding his circumstance that day?

Jehovah Jireh is *The-LORD-Will-Provide*, not *The-LORD-Did-Provide*. What is the difference between recognizing our provisions are *from* God and depending on Him *for* those provisions?

Can you think of a time when you depended on Him for a provision? Share your thoughts here.
