



STUDY OVERVIEW

Dear Parents,

When we enter a salvation relationship with Jesus, our identity is forever changed. A new identity is born in place of the old one. This is the “new creation” Paul talks about in 2 Corinthians 5. This new identity is one that finds its definition and purpose in Christ.

The Bible has a lot to say about our identity in Christ, and over the next four weeks, we’ll be studying what it says. We’re going to give your teen four snapshots of what his or her identity in Christ looks like. Our students will learn what Jesus meant when He challenged them to be salt and light; they’ll be reminded that Jesus defines greatness differently than the world; they’ll learn that their true purpose is found in remaining in Christ; and they’ll see that Jesus wants to use them to reach the lost.

Over the next four weeks, you’ll be receiving reminders from me as we teach through this study. I’ll be providing you with an overview of what we will cover, as well as some follow-up questions you and your teenager might use to continue the conversation.

Here are a few ways you can help your teenager begin to grasp what his or her new identity in Christ means for their life.

- Pray for your teenager and the others walking through this Bible study.
- Look for some of the verses that we discuss in the follow-up letters and work through them with your child.
- Be open and honest with them about your own questions you have about this concept.
