#### Senior Pastor Report for the Quarterly Business Meeting - Sunday, April 23, 2023

I want to begin by expressing gratitude for all of you who serve the ministry of Grace Fellowship and especially for those who have stepped up to fill areas of ministry as our search teams work to fill pastoral staff positions. Your commitment enables us to continue to do all we do with excellence to the glory of God! We are indeed better together.

The first quarter has flown by. In addition to my pastoral and preaching and counseling responsibilities, I am blessed to have been able to be part of our search teams' efforts in evaluating and interviewing candidates, praying for God's direction, and moving the process forward. I am excited about the future God has in store for Grace Fellowship.

I was asked to be part of a group to consider ways that we might help Greene County Christian Outreach (GCCO) in downtown Greensboro stay operational. After a number of meetings and with a lot of thought and prayer, a plan was devised to reorganize and replace the governing board with a new board, to expand the hours of operation, and to find sources of revenue beyond the income of the thrift store. Other Grace Fellowship members came on board to help shepherd the process, and today the new board is serving and GCCO is continuing its work of assisting the needy in our community.

Although it took place at the beginning of the 2nd quarter, I want to take the opportunity to applaud the efforts of our Evangelism/Outreach Team and the host of volunteers who made our Easter weekend celebration so wonderful. In spite of the rain, over 100 children and their parents showed up for an indoor egg hunt, along with crafts, bounce houses, cookie decorations, and a lot of fun. I was privileged to share the gospel story with those families to show how Easter is much more than bunny rabbits and candy eggs. This was followed by cold but glorious sunrise service and a meaningful worship service on Sunday with nearly 300 in attendance.

We had no baptisms in the first quarter, but we have celebrated seven thus far in April. God is good!

As we look forward to the rest of the year that is before us (Lord willing), we are excited to add additional pastors, continue to find ways to enhance our facilities, grow our children and youth ministries, bless families, serve our neighbors, and share the good news of Jesus. We are better together, that is for sure.

#### **MISSIONS TEAM**

The Missions Team is pleased to support the outreach efforts of Grace Fellowship by setting the budget for each year, setting goals and publicizing Southern Baptist missions offerings, educating the congregation about missions, and actively supporting missions causes locally, nationally, and worldwide.

This past quarter, the mission team encouraged and educated the church members of the North American Mission Board Annie Armstrong offering. To date, Grace Fellowship has collected over \$17,000!!!! Thank you to all who has supported the spreading of the Gospel!

This past quarter, the mission team identified and agreed to a diaper and wipes drive for the Family Heritage Foundation, which serves, supports, educates, mentors, witnesses and encourages refugees from many different countries in the world. They are located in Clarkston, Georgia. The team agreed to have the collection drive in June, which is refugee recognition month. The mission team, along with any volunteers will distribute in July.

The team also discussed and are in the process of planning a Skype type call with Bennet and Idong Ekandum, the founders of Family Heritage Foundation. This will enable the church members to meet the Ekandums and to learn more about their Foundation and the people that are served.

The team has also instigated the resumption of the Mission Minutes to resume once a month. The team will contact various missions that Grace supports and get updated videos and prayer needs in order to keep the members of Grace updated on the missions that they support.

And finally, the team supported the Dominican Republic mission team and their upcoming pretrip needs.

In the coming months, we plan to continue our efforts to support local ministries, educate Grace Fellowship members of the ministries and missions our church supports by continuing the MissionnMinutes on the 2nd Sunday of each month, sharing any prayer requests made from each mission with the church congregation, encourage support of missions giving and make contact with each of the missions that our church supports as well as begin the education and planning for the Dominican Republic mission team and more opportunities with Family Heritage Foundation as well an any local, potential mission opportunities.
