An evangelistic video prepared by Pastor Jimmy was shown to all attendees and both children and adults went home with bible story books and a 90 day devotional to help "Seekers" build a relationship with Christ. Director of Children's Ministry Report

Cassidy Callaway

September-December 2023

A proposal to update the children's area was submitted to the elders and pastoral staff in the month of September. After that was approved, the rooms were painted and I began decorating each one with a theme. The goal is to give the rooms a facelift and let the children experience the beauty and wonder of Creation each time they enter their class. The nursery theme is rainbows, the bathroom is The Flood, the toddler room is under the sea, the preschool room is jungle, and the kindergarten room is dinosaurs. Although not yet completed, I hope the kids and volunteers have been enjoying watching the progress!

I have discussed with Joey and a couple of Wednesday night volunteers about the future of Wednesday night childcare and what we want that to look like. Another childcare worker was hired to help fill in Wednesday nights.

Discussions about the children's Sunday school class began back in the fall. We combined the 1-2 grade and 3-4 grade class to mirror the class of Kids@Grace, and a new curriculum has been implemented that works better for those combined grade levels.

Another curriculum change was removing the toddler class from the shared curriculum of the preschool and kindergarten classes. As of October, the toddler class now follows its own, more simplified curriculum. Additionally, I reworked the schedules in Kids Cove to reduce the number of volunteers needed and to make better use of our time with the curriculum we currently use.

With the goal of keeping the children's ministry relevant to the entire church, the children's page was added back into the newsletter, I added a bulletin board with monthly curriculum info for parents, and I also spoke before the church about the department with plans to do this regularly.

I am a member of the Master Planning Team and have met with them several times as we discuss the future of Grace Fellowship. Recently our homework was to submit a 5-year plan for our departments, so after consulting with a few of our main children's volunteers, I submitted my plan for the future of this ministry.

From the end of the summer to the end of 2023, the average number of children in attendance in Kids Cove on Sundays was 10.6. There was a lapse of attendance being taken in Kids@Grace in 2023 due to a technical error, but the average number of children in that class is around 6-8. Attendance for the Sunday school class will be taken starting in January.

Elder Report for the 2024 Annual Business Meeting

We have seen a lot of growth this year in numbers and ministry due to the members of this body continuing to pursue their relationship with our Lord.

Because Grace fellowship's members truly **Believe** our hope is in Christ alone, we have made this local body a place where we truly **Belong** as we **Become** more like Jesus daily.

As always, the highlight of every elder get together is when we discuss and pray by name for the members and attenders of Grace Fellowship. You are Prayed for by name!

#### A few key points of the year:

- Called and onboarded of new pastoral staff in Matt MacLeod and Joey Wood.
- Recruited and installed new deacon of benevolence Rex Millburn.
- Roof repairs were completed.
- Cassidy Callaway installed as our new Children's Ministry Director. (We are so blessed to have her!)
- Approved the new, updated financial policy as submitted by the Finance Team.
- Revised and approved the new Children's and Youth Protection Policies. We will have an implementation team to see to the implementation and education of those affected by these new policies.
- Reworked the Building Team to handle the maintenance of the facilities. (We are still looking for a few people if you have interest)
- Administrative Coordinator Kevin Smith has notified us of his upcoming retirement after he helps get us through the upcoming budget season.
- Assembled and began meeting the new Master Planning Team with the goal of putting together a
  comprehensive plan for the next 5 years for church personnel, programs, and property. The outline of this is
  completed and will be revised to present to the church after elder approval.
- We still need a committed member to serve as Deacon our Mercy Team. This would be someone to lead
  volunteers to minister directly to those in moments of loss or crisis. If you have interest or a recommendation,
  please contact Pastor Jimmy.
- Continued our membership restoration process by contacting members that we may have not heard from or seen in a while. Several members re-engaged praise God!
- Elder liaisons (each Elder has a ministry team he is assigned to communicate with providing clear communication
  with the elders as needed) coordinated with individual ministry teams to assemble a budget for 2024 to present
  to the church for consideration.
- The holiday season her was wonderful with a fantastic Christmas Eve Candlelight service.
- The individual ministry teams are continuing to make an impact and are growing. Small groups are continuing to grow spiritually and numerically, and the children's ministry is booming! (If you want to be a part of a successful team talk with Cassidy Callaway) The youth are amazing. These kids are getting the Word, and 25-30 kids are in the ministry every Wednesday! As good as the past has been, The Best Is Yet To come!

- 1. The Elders move the approval of the 2024 ministry budget.

- 3. The Elders move that \$9,000 be set aside from the General Fund to be used in support of Pastor Jimmy's sabbatical. The sabbatical has been approved by the Elders and is scheduled for August-October of this year.

### Grace Fellowship,

Reflecting on the past six months at our church, we are glad to be part of the communal spirit, and shared passion for spiritual growth within our congregation. As a church, our primary purpose is to "Glorify God by bringing people into life-changing relationship with Christ." We want to joyfully do these things by prioritizing the commission of Christ, to go and make disciples with urgency.

We commenced a structured 52-week lesson series with our youth, taking them on a comprehensive journey through the entire Bible. Currently we have completed phase 1 and have entered phase 2 "The Fall" with the new year. To reflect our desire for growth, we have initiated a search for an intern and a bi-vocational youth director to streamline our discipleship and youth endeavors together.

By October, we had begun strategic planning for 2024, devising forward-thinking strategies for nurturing our youth. These plans encompass a continued study of the entire Bible and hosting biannual camps with an intentional focus of multiplying disciples.

To support our vision, we established a growth-focused budget for our Youth, Children, and Discipleship areas, which would include an internship for VBS, discipleship and small group activities for youth, more focused training for current small group leaders, recruitment for future leaders, and strategic planning to bring discipleship to Green County communities.

This strategy would incorporate a "Garden of Groups" that is comprised of anything from HOST Homes, on campus groups, off-campus small groups, one-on-two discipleship (IMPACT), or a group of twenty.

In the spirit of unity and faith, we move forward into the next half of the year, committed to continued growth, community, the teaching of God's Word, and to the glory of God.

### Pastor Of Worship and Community Annual Report for JAN. 2024

Nadene and I greatly appreciate the welcome we received from the Grace community. It has been a fast paced 6 months since arriving at Grace in July 2023. While many churches have similar backgrounds or may look similar in operation and opportunity, the culture and flow of ministry can very different. As such, getting acclimated to those things here at Grace while learning processes, systems, and names (still working on that) has been a challenge, but I believe we have covered a lot of ground in a short amount of time. Here is a guick snapshot of the ministry since July.

- Following a ministry meet and greet with worship and tech team members, and an expected adjustment period, the worship ministry settled into a good flow. From those in the band to those in the booth, we've been able to work well together in leading God's people weekly into His presence.
- Speaking of those in the band and the booth, I certainly want to offer a word of "THANKS!" to those serving.
  - In the band: "Rocky" Davidson (Bass), Stuart Harris (Acoustic/Electric Guitar), Serenity Jackson (Flute/Vocals), Brian McClure (Piano), Kelly Clower (Vocals), Tammy Leavell (Vocals), Nadene MacLeod (Vocals), Stacy Malone (Vocals).
  - In the Booth, Nancy Long has been a super support coordinating and leading this team including those doing Sound: Ron Mohammed, Linda Parrish, and Tery Wilcoxson / Projection and Lights: Dana Janes, Andrew McElhannon, Kellie Sharpe, Michael Wells / Streaming: Curtis Crumbley, Brett Hanson, Isaiah Hawks, Saige Nobis / Camera: Lucas Human, Jasper Warwick
- Also, a word of "THANKS!" to a couple who have moved on from Grace: Rick Cook (Trumpet)
  and Michael McGough (Interim Worship Leader). We appreciate them for their example and
  faithful service.
- During the 6 months we've added 8 new worship songs, a couple new Christmas songs during Advent, and included 17 hymns/ hymn arrangements.
- The choir ministry is back up and running, currently focusing on weekly preparations as a praise and worship choir.
- We've had some small adjustments to our stage layout with some changes in band participants, the consistency of 4 vocals per week, and the choir coming back. Additionally, we do have some other things that are already being considered or in the works.
- In the area of technology there has been little in terms of changes, but a fair bit of time has been given to learning the installed systems. I have met with an outside audio/visual company and shared possible updates and heard some recommendations. As we look ahead in this area I do anticipate some things will be addressed over time.
- We added a service of Praise and Thanksgiving leading into Thanksgiving week.

- I love the Christmas season, and our month of Advent was a joy to be a part of touching on the weekly themes of hope, peace, joy, and love, and culminated with our Christmas Eve candlelight service.

A few none worship focused notables over the past months include:

- Participation in the Fall Family Fun Day, both behind the scenes and during the event.
- Connecting with a few of the local missions supported by Grace (In person meetings with Atlas, FCA, and Habitat).
- Pulpit supply
- Serving on the elder counsel has been very beneficial in gaining an understanding of the ministry at Grace. Likewise, serving on the Master Planning Team has been valuable in unpacking the strategic plan and outlining many possible next steps for our ministry.

## Senior Pastor Report for the January 2024 Annual Business Meeting

This year marks the 20th anniversary of Grace Fellowship. On July 4, 2004, we gathered for our first worship service in the auditorium of the Greene County High School. Since that day we have seen God do remarkable things in the lives of individuals and families. We continue to see people come to know Jesus as Savior and continue to celebrate the spiritual growth and life-transformation of so many. It has been and continues to be an honor to serve as Senior Pastor of this wonderful group of believers.

The theme for this year is "20 Years of Grace," and our official Anniversary Celebration will be on July 7. That weekend, our 20th Anniversary Team will host a dinner for all the charter members who can attend. Also that weekend, we will distribute a short pictorial history of the church. You can look forward to hearing testimonies rejoicing in the way God has moved over the past two decades.

This is also the year we begin some much-needed improvements and upgrades to our campus. The first phase will see a new Welcome Center and Information Are in the Gathering Space. This will open up the entry area and provide a beautiful and functional area for new people to be welcomed and members to connect in ministry. The plan is to have this complete in the first half of the year. The second phase will focus on carpet, paint, and stage upgrades in the Worship Center. Future phases will work on the signage outside the building and the parking lot, however the completion of the Master Planning Team's work may highlight more critical needs.

Using our Strategic Plan, the Master Planning Team is continuing its work and should have a report ready for the Elders in the first quarter. The plan, once approved, will be used to guide our ministries programing, staff development, and facilities growth for at least the next 5 years. We look forward to seeing all that the Lord will do as we live out our mission of glorifying God by bringing people into a life-changing relationship with Jesus Christ.

One of the major accomplishments of this past year was the writing of our Children and Youth Protection Policies. Grace Fellowship holds to the highest standards of caring for and teaching children and youth in a safe and loving environment. We want parents to feel completely comfortable leaving their children in the care of leaders who have gone through background checks and training. Each person who works with youth or children is expected to read, understand, and abide by the protection policies. Any variations from this policy will be noted and action taken. Our Children's Director Cassidy Callaway and our Discipleship Pastor Joey Wood will work with the staff and elders to ensure compliance and to take any actions deemed necessary. We will be bringing all our current workers under the new policy, and this will mean some of them will need to go through new background checks and complete the training course.

We are excited to bring new Elders onto the council this year, and we thank our outgoing Elder Chairman Luke Miller and Elder Bobby Thomas for their faithful service. We also miss Brett Hansen who stepped down for health reasons and Dave Christenson who resigned because of moving to be closer to family. I ask that you pray for our current and new Elders as they seek to follow the Lord in leading this church family.

I rejoice that Grace Fellowship continues to be a church that declares salvation through Jesus, proclaims the uncompromising truth of God's Word, prays without ceasing, serves one another in humility, and has a heart for those outside our walls. In this past year, this church gave over \$195,000 to ministry and missions causes in our city and throughout the world. We sent men and women to the Dominican Republic, Wears Valley Ranch, and throughout their own neighborhoods. We set up our prayer tent in public places and offered prayers to any in need. In short, we made a difference this past year ... and the best is yet to come!
