

As we move into the final quarter of 2025, I want to take a moment to express my heartfelt appreciation to our Grace Fellowship family for your faithfulness and generosity throughout this year. Your giving has been a visible expression of your love for the Lord and your commitment to His work here and around the world.

Through the first three quarters of this year, our church has given nearly \$125,000 to ministry and missions causes. This includes support for our missions teams serving in Zambia, Wears Valley Ranch, the Dominican Republic, and our ongoing support of the Cooperative Program of the Southern Baptist Convention. Because of your faithfulness, lives are being touched and transformed by the gospel of Jesus Christ.

I am especially grateful for the strong giving we experienced during the summer months, which allowed us to move forward in ministry and rebuild some of the reserve we had lost over the past two years. Our staff and ministry teams have also demonstrated wise stewardship, keeping expenses below budget while continuing to serve faithfully and effectively.

At this point in the year, giving remains ahead of last year's pace. That's a wonderful testimony to your faithfulness. As we look toward the final months of 2025, I am hopeful that our giving will continue to be strong—enabling us not only to finish the year well but also to plan boldly for ministry in the new year and beyond.

ELDER UPDATE

Elder Communication for the November 2025 Newsletter

The Elder Council met for its regularly monthly meeting on Tuesday, October 21. A.J. Hunt opened the meeting with prayer. This was followed by the devotion given by Nolan Callaway. The minutes of the September Elder Council meeting were considered and approved.

Each month the Elders recite from memory the church mission statement as a means to remind us to stay focused on what is most important. The mission statement reads: "Grace Fellowship exists to glorify God by bringing people into a life-changing relationship with Jesus Christ." May the Lord guide us as we seek to pursue this mission!

Mike Moore, who serves as the Elder liaison for the Finance Team gave a positive update on giving and the budget. Our target reserve for the church operating account is having 2 months of budget on hand. As of the end of September, our reserve fund stands at 4.67 months. Giving in 2025 has exceeded the same time period for 2024 by \$112,322. Expenses continue to be monitored carefully, and currently overall spending is less than what was budgeted. It was suggested that a letter go out to the church as an update on our current status and encouragement to our faithful givers as the fiscal year comes to a close.

The Elders entered a time of discussion for the known prayer needs of our membership, as well as the needs of each Elder. Pastor Jimmy lifted up those needs in prayer. Please let us know of any particular needs that you have, so that we can more effectively pray for this church family.

Items of business considered during this meeting were -

- One of the efforts discussed by the Elders to encourage the unchurched to attend has to do with updating our reviews on the Google search engine. Members and small groups are encouraged to leave reviews about Grace Fellowship on Google. This is yielding results with now 50 reviews being active. Joey Wood is coordinating this through the small group ministry.
- The Elders considered the recommendations for new Elders from the church. Each recommendation was considered and the Elders look forward to continuing the evaluation process and presenting a candidate or candidates for a church vote in January.
- A number of building and grounds needs were discussed. These needs are being prioritized based on safety and long-term impact. Among these items were: the addition of a children's restroom, replacing windows in the building, adding a storage building, removing the pavilion and future replacement, new road sign, needed audio/visual upgrades, and replacement of the office copier. Each item has a an estimated cost. Some items will be planned for and budgeted. Other needs will be addressed when necessary. The church will be kept informed as to the needs and any actions that will take place.


The next Elder Council meeting will be held on Tuesday, November 18. If there are items of business to be considered, please contact one of the Elders or the Senior Pastor.



Please pray about this and if you feel led by the Holy Spirit to participate in this ministry then read on...

We need a lot of homemade cookies for the Kairos weekend.

Directions are:

- Each cookie should be approximately 2" to 3" in diameter.
- Cookies should be baked with prayer.
- Cookies should be sealed in a Ziploc bag. 6 cookies per bag.
- If you use peanut butter or nuts in your recipes then the bags of cookies containing these ingredients need to be labeled as such.
- A note should be placed in each bag to say something about God's love such as: "Jesus loves you and so do we."
