

WHO IS LOTTIE MOON?

On July 7, 1873, Charlotte "Lottie" Moon was appointed as a missionary to China. With a bold spirit and a heart full of love for the Lord, she dedicated her life to sharing the gospel with the people of China — faithfully serving until her passing on December 24, 1912.

Lottie's life was marked by deep compassion, courageous obedience, and tireless commitment to God's call. Her sacrificial life demonstrated the impact one person can have when fully surrendered to Christ. She inspired many others to consider their role in missions.

Through her heartfelt letters home, Lottie encouraged churches to support missions through their prayers and giving. Those efforts led to the creation of the Lottie Moon Christmas Offering® for International Missions, which continues today — supporting missionaries around the world as they share the hope of Christ.

Lottie's story reminds us that faithful service to God can make an eternal impact. You can make an eternal impact too, following Lottie's example — by praying fervently for missionaries around the world and giving sacrificially to help take the gospel to the nations.

ELDER UPDATE

The Elder Communication for the December 2025 Newsletter

The Elder Council met in their regular meeting on Tuesday, November 18, 2025. The Elders present were: Randy Scott, Stuart Harris, Mike Moore, Mac Manley, Steven Brondyke, David Tolbert, AJ Hunt, Nolan Callaway, and Pastor Jimmy Long. In addition, Matt Macleod, Joey Wood, and Hank Raehn were there representing the staff.

Pastor Jimmy opened the meeting in prayer. This was followed by a devotional from Mike Moore focused on Jesus' call for us to be servants.

The Elders reminded one another of our church's mission, then approved both the minutes from the October Elders Meeting and the financial report presented by the Finance Team. Mike Moore provided an update from the Finance Team related to current giving and budget planning. The plan is to have a draft budget for the Elders to consider in the December meeting. Below is a summary of giving this month and year-to-date.

During staff reports, Pastor Jimmy reminded the Elders that we will celebrate baptism during our December 7 worship service.

The Elders entered a time of discussion for the known prayer needs of our membership, as well as the needs of each elder. Following this, Pastor Jimmy prayed for the names and needs as well as the Elders and his family.

Pastor Jimmy informed the church that Hannah Fowler has agreed to consider the position of Church Clerk (a church officer) to replace Jonni Ghetti who is completing her term in that position. We appreciate Jonni's commitment and look forward to affirming Hannah in January. In addition, Pam Scott agreed to serve as a member of the Finance Team in the role of Assistant Treasurer. This appointment will not require approval in January.

The Elders then entered in a discussion of building repair and update priorities. There is a plan to ensure the pavilion is safe for ongoing use for the next decade. Issues with stability and a leak in the roof are issues of concern, and we look forward to having this resolved for the ongoing use of the pavilion. Other issues are being considered, and we will keep the church informed.

The next scheduled Elder Council meeting is December 16. If there are that you would like addressed, please contact any of the elders to request it be placed on our agenda.


