ELDER UPDATE

Elder Communication for the October 2026 Newsletter

The Elder Council met for its regularly monthly meeting on Tuesday, September 16. The Elders present were Randy Scott, Stuart Harris, Mike Moore, Tom Lynn, Stephen Brondyke, David Tolbert, and Mac Manley. Matt MacLeod, Joey Wood, and Hank Raehn were the staff members in attendance with Pastor Jimmy out on vacation.

Tom Lynn opened the meeting with a devotion. This was followed by the approval of the minutes from the previous month's meeting.

Mike Moore, who serves as the Elder liaison for the Finance Team gave a positive update on giving and the budget. Our target reserve for the church operating account is having 2 months of budget on hand. As of the end of August, our reserve fund stands at 4.6 months. Giving in 2025 has exceeded the same time period for 2024 by ~\$129,000. Expenses continue to be monitored carefully, and currently overall spending is less than what was budgeted.

The Elders entered a time of discussion for the known prayer needs of our membership, as well as the needs of each Elder. Stuart Harris lifted up those needs in prayer. Please let us know of any particular needs that you have, so that we can more effectively pray for this church family.

Items of business considered during this meeting were -

- Pastor Joey Wood brought the Elders up to date on the small group starting in Del Webb. This is part of our ongoing effort to make disciples in our community and encourage people to connect with our church family.
- Joey also informed the Elders that the home school CO-OP has gotten off to a good start. They are meeting Friday mornings in the church building. Please pray for the families involved.
- Hank Raehn shared that our Kickin' for the Kingdom kickball tournament raised \$17,000 to support our mission trips in 2026. Thank you for your prayers and participation in this missions fundraiser.
- Our lake fellowship and baptism on Sunday, September had a great turn out. Ten were baptized that day, and we rejoice in the Lord continuing to entrust souls to this church family.
- The Elder Council gave final approval to the revisions to the Children's Ministry Policies. This church is committed to children, youth, and families, and we want to create safe and loving environments for them to encounter the love and truth of Jesus.
- The Elders discussed the upcoming Elder Selection process, and appreciate the recommendations provided by the church family.
- A number of building and grounds needs were discussed. These are being prioritized so that planning and budgeting can be considered. We'll keep the church informed as to future updates.

The next Elder Council meeting will be held on Tuesday, October 21. If there are items of business to be considered, please contact one of the Elders or the Senior Pastor.


