

Joseph "Yellow Kid" Weil — if the name doesn't ring a bell, the movie <u>The Sting</u> starring Robert Redford and Paul Newman might — that Oscar-winning classic was inspired by him.

Joseph Weil started down the road of deception young, hustling gullible farmers by selling them cheap glasses in "solid gold" frames. But those early scams were just a warm-up. His true masterpiece? Creating an entire fake bank.

Weil got lucky when word spread through town that the National Traders Bank of Muncie was relocating. Seizing the moment, he rented a house in the right neighborhood and "opened" his own version of the bank. Chicago gangsters played the roles of bank tellers and clerks, and unsuspecting locals walked in — and handed over their cash like it was any other day at the bank.

But those small deposits weren't the real prize. Weil had his eyes on a local multimillionaire.

To make the con believable, he let the wealthy man stew in the waiting room for an hour, then, posing as the "banker," haggled endlessly over a fake land deal — finally "reluctantly agreeing" to sell nonexistent property for half a million dollars.

And if that wasn't outrageous enough? Weil went on to swindle Benito Mussolini himself, selling the Italian dictator "exclusive rights" to develop imaginary mines in Colorado.

Money loved Joseph Weil — and he loved spending it. Lavish living, beautiful women, and a reputation as one of the boldest con men America ever saw. (excerpt from Dr. Neil Gale's article on

Joseph Weil died in 1976...of old age, while living in an assisted living facility. He did spend a total of 6 years in prison during his life but for the most part he avoided the penalties associated with such a nefarious lifestyle. In fact, when reading some of the accounts of his life, I sensed that this man was a bit revered, a celebrity of sorts owing to Mr. Weil's panache and all the scams he successfully engineered.


But there is little written about the people whose lives were impacted by Mr. Weil's skullduggery. Those folks who trusted the fake bank mentioned above and willingly handed over their hard-earned money - can you imagine their anger, bewilderment, or feelings of having been vandalized? I imagine some of these people refused to trust another financial institution...choosing instead to hide their money in mattresses!

This account of the "fake bank" con led me down the road of thinking about people who come to a church expecting one thing...but experience something entirely different. Jesus warned religious people about becoming "like whitewashed tombs, which outwardly appear beautiful, but within are full of dead people's bones and all uncleanness." Most people visit a church expecting to encounter love and grace and kindness, a welcoming quality that can't be experienced in anything the world has to offer. Imagine their consternation when "church" people are acting just like the rest of the world? I imagine some of these people might refuse to ever trust another spiritual gathering!
