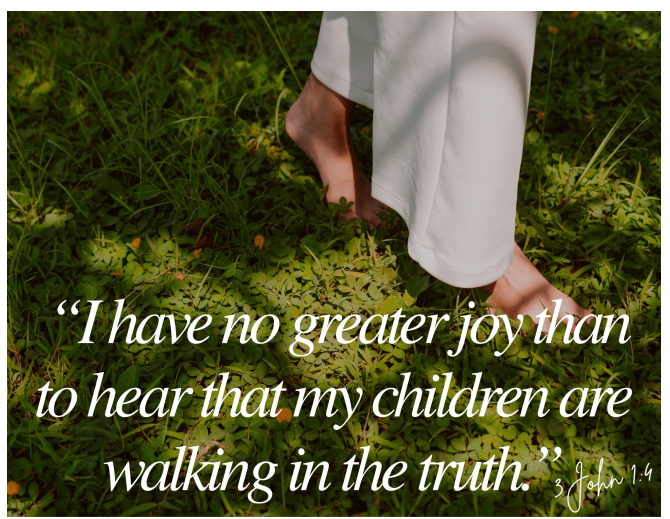

I recently happened upon an interesting article that probed the findings of a newly published study examining the use and knowledge of modern slang. 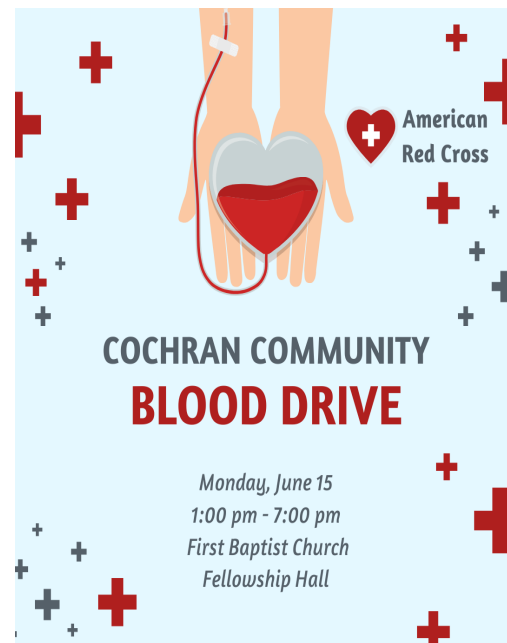
Currently popular slang words/phrases:

But slang isn’t a new phenomenon; every generation has its own cache of slang words. My teenage decade (the glorious ’70’s) had the following slang: skinny, can you dig it, psyche, jive turkey, the crib, spaz, dream on, far out, hang ten, to the max, yo mamma, chill, fab, right on, to the max, 4-sho, be there or be square, 10-4 good buddy, etc. What slang were you throwing around in your teenage years? On a humorous note, here’s a slang term that makes me giggle: **sub-slang**, which refers to slang words that get their roots from parent level slang words. Slang offspring!!! Who knew??!

Some additional findings of the study examining the use and knowledge of modern slang are: **1)** Americans are too old to use slang at the age of 43; **2)** 37% found slang use in the workplace completely unacceptable; **3)** there exists a widespread knowledge gap when it comes to knowing the meaning of slang, and also the appropriate use of slang; **4)** 50% of respondents think it’s a bad idea to use a slang word without really understanding its definition.
