



## **COVID-19 Safe Practice Guidelines for Waxahachie Bible Church AWANA Meetings**

**Waxahachie Bible Church and the WBC AWANA Team care deeply about the safety of everyone that participates in the AWANA Ministry. It is our commitment to help keep everyone as safe as possible. Please see the following action plan for AWANA meetings.**

- 1. The church building will be sanitized prior to each AWANA meeting.**
- 2. Anyone entering the building on Sunday night for AWANA meetings will have their temperature checked. Anyone running a fever will not be permitted to stay for the AWANA meeting.**
- 3. Hand sanitizer will be available at the check in desk and throughout the church building. Everyone should use hand sanitizer prior to and after using the computers for check in.**
- 4. Opening and closing ceremony will still be in the FUSE Room with chairs set up. Each clubber and adults in attendance will sit in the chairs maintaining an empty chair between each person.**
- 5. Game Time activities will be on the grassy area between the two front parking areas of the church building that faces Grand Avenue. Individual cold bottled water will be provided for all clubbers and adults in attendance.**
- 6. Any theme night activity that involves the serving of food will be handled with individually packaged food items. One adult wearing a mask and gloves will assist with food items.**
- 7. Everyone in attendance will be encouraged to observe the 6 feet social distancing suggestion. The AWANA Team will help the children with this.**
- 8. Everyone should wash their hands after using the restroom.**
- 9. As per current Waxahachie Bible Church policy, wearing masks are optional and up to each individual and parent.**
- 10. If a parent chooses to have their child wear a mask, the parent should make clear to their child that they must have the mask on at all times. The parent should inform their child's club director or leader of this request. The AWANA Team will do their best to ensure that the child keeps the mask on. If this becomes a problem, the parent will be asked to attend the meeting with their child to help with this.**
