

Marsh serves as rector of St. Philip's Episcopal Church in Uvalde, Texas, the exact parish where on May 24th a horrific mass shooting of school children within Robb Elementary School took place. Fr. Marsh is a prolific blogger (Interrupting the Silence), a celebrated preacher, a devout parish priest, and a pastoral presence that remains saturated in prayer. Fr. Marsh is a reconciling



presence within a community that is wrapped in anger, hurt, disappointment and fear. He is a graduate of the University of Texas, El Paso (BA), Texas Tech University (JD), and the University of the South, Sewanee (MDiv). In addition to serving as rector of St. Philip's in Uvalde, he also serves as adjunct faculty at the Seminary of the Southwest in Austin. 
FROM ST. CHRISTOPHER'S RANTOUL


EPISCOPAL SUMMER CAMP 2023
