Mt. Carmel Putnam Grant Distribution

Representatives from five missions and parishes of the Diocese met at the Effingham Episcopal Fellowship Mass on December 10th with Fr. David Knox of Trinity, Mattoon serving as celebrant and preacher. Grants from the Putnam Trust, shared by the people of St. John the Baptist Episcopal Church in Mt Carmel, were distributed to five of the seven congregations receiving this year's monies. Churches



receiving grants included Albion, Alton, Cairo, Centralia, Effingham Episcopal Fellowship, Mattoon, and Morton, with grant amounts ranging from \$2,500 to \$15,000. Funds will be used for windows, signage, roof repair, vicarage renovation, and for the support of outreach/evangelism initiatives.

Diocesan Appeal
