


148th Annual Synod Keynote Speaker

Bishop Burgess is pleased to announce that The Reverend Canon Lang Lowrey of the Diocese of Atlanta has accepted the invitation to offer the keynote address during this year's 148th Annual Synod. Canon Lowrey and his son are principals of the Lowrey Group of Georgia. After a several-year break to become ordained as an Episcopal priest and lead the start-up of an Atlanta-area parish and school as founding vicar, Lang has returned to the business world with a fresh perspective on moving organizations forward.

for the future through long-term leases and other property strategies. Lowrey's foundational premise is this: consider your properties as endowments, not liabilities. They are gifted to us to support and fund current and future ministries. "People say that churches are in decline. I look at it differently. Churches are consolidating and coming out stronger when they do," Lowrey says, "and that leaves a lot of real estate that can be used for mission purposes or income purposes."

Whether large or small property issues, this year's Saturday morning address will certainly invite questions and encourage a vision for development possibilities in interest of mission and ministry. "I tell churches, never ever, ever, sell their property," Lowery said. "You probably won't do that well. Churches get taken advantage of by developers. They want to buy low and sell high."

All sale of property must also have diocesan approval. This means that real estate listing agreements may not be signed until diocesan approval is received. Within the Diocese of Atlanta, Canon Lowrey works with parishes and organizations to submit a package to the Standing Committee to seek approval, and is asked to recommend or not recommend the project.

Plan now on joining us for this time of discovery and learning. We look forward to sharing in this time with our clergy, Synod delegates, and guests.
