The Red Sea Crossing - Exodus 13-15

Story Point: God led His people through the Red Sea on dry ground.

Summary: After the Passover, the Israelites left Egypt. God was with them and led them toward the Red Sea. One day, the Israelites saw the Egyptians coming after them. “We are going to die! We should have stayed in Egypt!” they said. Moses told them, “Do not be afraid. God brought you here, and He will fight for you.” God told Moses to stretch his hand over the sea. Moses did, and the sea was divided in two. The Israelites walked on dry ground, with walls of water on both sides. As the Egyptians came closer, God made the wheels of their chariots swerve and wobble so they could not catch the Israelites. When the Israelites were safe on the other side of the sea, Moses stretched out his hand again and the waters returned, covering the Egyptians and sweeping away the king’s army. When the Israelites saw what had happened, they thanked God. Moses and the Israelites sang a song to the Lord. “The Lord has saved us!”

Questions:

Big Picture Question: Is there anything God cannot do? God can do all things.

1. Who chased the Israelites? (Pharaoh’s army)
2. What happened when Moses stretched out his hand? (God divided the water, and the Israelites crossed the Red Sea on dry ground.)
3. What happened to Pharaoh’s army? (God made the waters come back together over them.)
4. What did the people do afterwards? (They worshiped God.)
5. Memorize **Hosea 13:4b** as a family: “You know no God but Me, and no Savior exists besides Me.”

Christ Connection: Moses led God’s people out of Egypt, and God gave them the way to freedom across the Red Sea. Moses was a great leader, but the Bible says Jesus is greater. God gives us freedom from sin through His Son, Jesus.

Questions:

Big Picture Question: Is there anything God cannot do? God can do all things according to His character.

1. Was God surprised when Pharaoh decided to chase after the Israelites? (No, God knew that Pharaoh would do so and told Moses before it happened.)
2. What did the Israelites do after God parted the sea and closed it on the Egyptians? (They feared God, trusted in Him, and sang a song of worship to Him.)
3. What is the ultimate way God rescued people? (Help your kids see that Jesus' death and resurrection, which brings us salvation is the most important and loving rescue God has ever made.)

Christ Connection: Moses led the Israelites out of Egypt, and God provided a way for them to escape through the Red Sea. The Bible says that Jesus is greater than Moses (Hebrews 3:3). People who trust in Jesus escape the penalty of sin and have eternal life.

Questions:

Big Picture Question: Is there anything God cannot do? God can do all things according to His character.

1. The Israelites were afraid of Pharaoh's army. Do you think they believed that God could do anything? (No they did not, but Moses helped them know that God would fight for them against the Egyptians.)
2. What kinds of things do you complain about? Do you believe that God can do anything? (Invite your kids to share their honest thoughts and remind them of the Big Picture Question. God is good.)
3. How did the Israelites show faith as Moses led them out of Egypt? How does faith save us? (By crossing the Red Sea. - By trusting and believing in Jesus and the sacrifice He made for us.)

Christ Connection: Moses led the Israelites out of Egypt, and God provided a way for them to escape through the Red Sea. The Bible says that Jesus is greater than Moses (Hebrews 3:3). People who trust in Jesus escape the penalty of sin and have eternal life.
