The Call of Desperation

Romans 10:9, Romans 10:13, Luke 23:39-43

Summary: The gospel is good news, but only to those who respond to it. While Jesus died on the cross for our sins, Romans 10:9 and 10:13 tell us that we have to cry out to Him for salvation. Anyone who calls upon the name of the Lord will be saved.

Questions:

1. Romans 10:9 and 10:13 say to call upon the Lord for salvation. Does that seem too easy to you? Why or why not?
2. Luke 23:39-43 is proof that Romans 10:9 and 10:13 are true. Jesus saves one of the criminals who cries out. Did this criminal deserve to be saved over the other criminal who mocked Jesus? (Parent Tip: Lead them to the answer that neither deserved to be saved, but that only one was because he cried out for Jesus to save him)
3. Why can it be so easy to put off giving your life to Christ or living for Him every day?
4. What are some ways we can be more intentional as a family to share the gospel more?
