1. What is one thing from the message that God used to encourage, challenge, or grow you?

3. Culture often says things like live your truth, follow your heart, or I'm not that bad. How do those messages shape the way people think about sin, forgiveness, and their need for Jesus? Share your thoughts.
4. Read Romans 3:21-26 and Romans 5:6-11. What do these passages teach us about the seriousness of sin, the holiness of God, and the love God demonstrated through Jesus' death on the cross?
5. Today we learned the cross is where God's justice and God's love meet. How does the cross help us understand God's holiness, justice, and His loving mercy at the same time? Which of these do you find the most difficult to understand? Which is the most amazing to you? Why?
6. We were reminded that many people spend their lives trying to earn what Jesus has already accomplished. What are some ways Christians can fall into the trap of trying to earn God's approval instead of living from the grace they have already received? Why?
7. Today we ended with the question, What will I do with what Jesus has done? What is one step you can take this week to respond to Jesus' sacrifice, grace, and resurrection power in your own life?
8. If someone asked you this question this week, how would you respond? Who is one person who needs to know this truth this week? What is your best next step in helping them know it?
