

WEEK 1 - God the Father — Why Creeds?

Creed Focus: We believe in one God, the Father Almighty, Maker of heaven and earth...

Big Idea: Faith begins with who God is.

Day 1 – I Believe in God’s Existence

Scripture: John 20:29, Romans 1:19–20, Psalm 19:1

Core Truth: Creation and conscience both testify that God exists; disbelief is not due to lack of evidence, but resistance to it.

Reflection: If God truly exists, how does that reshape your purpose, decisions, and daily priorities?

Day 2 – I Believe in One God

Scripture: Deuteronomy 6:4, Isaiah 45:5–6, 1 Timothy 2:5, 1 Corinthians 8:6

Core Truth: Christianity is not one option among many gods; it declares one sovereign Creator over all reality.

Reflection: How does believing in one God bring clarity and stability in a world filled with competing truths?

Day 3 – I Believe in the Triune God

Scripture: Genesis 1:26, Matthew 3:16–17, Matthew 28:19, John 1:1

Core Truth: The Trinity is not a later invention but a biblical revelation: one God eternally existing as Father, Son, and Spirit.

Reflection: How does knowing God is relational within Himself deepen your understanding of love and community?

Day 4 – I Believe in the Father

Scripture: Isaiah 64:8, Romans 8:14–17, Galatians 4:4–7, 1 John 3:1–2

Core Truth: God is not a distant force but a personal Father who adopts, loves, and secures His children.

Reflection: What does it mean for you personally to approach God as “Abba, Father”?

Day 5 – If This Is True, Then...

Scripture: Genesis 1:1, Romans 8:15, 1 John 3:1

Core Truth: If God exists, if He is one, and if He is Father, then life has purpose, identity, and eternal significance.

Reflection: Which truth from this week challenges or comforts you most — and how will you respond?

WEEK 2 - God the Father — Almighty Creator, Provider, & Sustainer**Creed Focus:** The Father Almighty, Maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible.**Big Idea:** The God who created all things actively rules, sustains, and knows His creation.**Day 1 – I Believe in the Almighty God****Scripture:** Genesis 1:1–3, Psalm 113:4–6, Psalm 139:7–10, Job 38:4–7**Core Truth:** God is not limited, reactive, or distant; Scripture reveals Him as omnipotent, omnipresent, and omniscient — ruling over creation with sovereign authority.**Reflection:** Where do you most need to trust God’s power rather than your own control?**Day 2 – I Believe God Is...****Scripture:** 1 John 4:8, 1 John 1:5, Deuteronomy 32:4, Psalm 102:27, Psalm 100:5**Core Truth:** God’s character is not self-defined by culture; it is revealed in Scripture — He is love, light, just, eternal, good, and opposed to evil.**Reflection:** Which attribute of God most strengthens your faith right now — and why?**Day 3 – Maker of Earth and All That Is Seen****Scripture:** Genesis 1:26–27, Psalm 19:1, Romans 8:18–22, Luke 19:40**Core Truth:** The physical world is not evil or accidental; it was intentionally created good by God and reflects His glory.**Reflection:** How does knowing you are made in God’s image shape your sense of worth and responsibility?**Day 4 – Maker of Heaven and All That Is Unseen****Scripture:** Nehemiah 9:6, Psalm 91:11, 2 Peter 2:4, Ephesians 6:12**Core Truth:** Reality includes both visible and invisible realms; Scripture affirms a spiritual world where angels serve God and evil is ultimately defeated through Christ.**Reflection:** How does recognizing the unseen spiritual battle change the way you pray and live?**Day 5 – If This Is True, Then...****Scripture:** Psalm 139:1–6, Genesis 1:27, Ephesians 6:10–13**Core Truth:** If God is almighty Creator of both the seen and unseen, then our lives are purposeful, protected, and part of a larger spiritual story.**Reflection:** Which truth from this week most challenges your assumptions about God — and what step of trust will you take?

WEEK 3 - God the Son — The Word Made Flesh

Creed Focus: And in one Lord Jesus Christ...the only-begotten Son of God...God of God, Light of Light, true God from true God...by whom all things were made...who for us and for our salvation came down from heaven...

Big Idea: Jesus is Lord — fully God, eternal, and the only Savior.

Day 1 – I Believe in the Lord, Jesus Christ

Scripture: Matthew 16:15–16, Luke 1:43, Mark 1:2–3, John 8:12

Core Truth: Jesus doesn't leave room for "just a good teacher"; His identity claims force a decision about who He truly is.

Reflection: How do you feel when hear the name Jesus? What's that reveal about what you believe?

Day 2 – I Believe in Jesus, From God the Father

Scripture: Hebrews 1:3, Colossians 1:15, John 14:9, John 12:44–45

Core Truth: Jesus is not a lesser being or merely "God-like"—He is the exact revelation of God's nature and the visible image of the invisible Father.

Reflection: If seeing Jesus is truly seeing the Father, what does that change about how you relate to God?

Day 3 – Through Jesus All Things Were Made

Scripture: John 1:1–3, John 1:14, Colossians 1:16–17, Revelation 1:8

Core Truth: Jesus didn't begin at Bethlehem—Scripture presents Him as eternal Creator and Sustainer, which grounds His authority and His ability to save.

Reflection: How does Jesus being eternal and sustaining "all things" strengthen your trust in Him?

Day 4 – Jesus Came to Bring Salvation to Us

Scripture: Romans 3:22–26, 1 Timothy 2:5–6, Hebrews 12:2, Philippians 2:6–8

Core Truth: Salvation is not self-improvement; it requires a mediator—only the God-man can satisfy justice and extend mercy through the cross.

Reflection: Where are you tempted to "save yourself," and what would it look like to receive grace instead?

Day 5 – If This Is True, Then...

Scripture: Romans 10:9–10, Colossians 1:17, John 14:6

Core Truth: If Jesus is Lord, eternal, and Savior, then He isn't an accessory to life—He has rightful authority over our worship, obedience, and witness.

Reflection: How does your life demonstrate that you believe Jesus is Lord—not just helpful, but King?

WEEK 4 - God the Son — Savior & Lord

Creed Focus: ...for us and for our salvation He came from heaven...was incarnate...suffered...was crucified...buried...rose again...ascended...and sits at the right hand of the Father.

Big Idea: The historical work of Christ secures our salvation and establishes His Lordship.

Day 1 – God Ordained Christ’s Birth

Scripture: Luke 1:34–35, Luke 2:52, Hebrews 4:15, John 1:14

Core Truth: The virgin birth is not myth but theological necessity—Jesus is fully God and fully man, uniquely qualified to mediate between God and humanity.

Reflection: How does knowing Jesus truly entered our humanity change the way you approach Him in weakness?

Day 2 – I Believe in Jesus’ Death and Burial

Scripture: Isaiah 53:5–6, Mark 8:31, Romans 3:23–26, Psalm 22:1

Core Truth: The cross was not an accident of history but the fulfillment of prophecy—Christ’s atoning death satisfied justice and extended mercy.

Reflection: What does it mean personally that Jesus took your guilt and bore God’s wrath in your place?

Day 3 – I Believe in Jesus’ Resurrection

Scripture: 1 Corinthians 15:3–4, 14–19, Romans 4:25, Luke 24:6–7

Core Truth: Christian faith stands or falls on the resurrection—if Christ is risen, His identity and promises are vindicated.

Reflection: How does the reality of the resurrection strengthen your hope in present struggles?

Day 4 – I Believe in Jesus’ Ascension

Scripture: Acts 1:9–11, Acts 2:34–35, 1 Peter 3:22, John 14:2–3

Core Truth: The ascension declares Christ’s finished work and present reign—He is not absent but enthroned and interceding.

Reflection: How does knowing Jesus reigns now shape your confidence about the future?

Day 5 – If This Is True, Then...

Scripture: Romans 8:1–2, Colossians 1:18, Hebrews 12:2

Core Truth: If Christ was incarnate, crucified, risen, and ascended, then condemnation is removed, death is defeated, and allegiance to Him is the only reasonable response.

Reflection: What area of your life needs to come under the lordship of the risen and reigning Christ?

WEEK 5 - God the Spirit — The Indwelling Presence

Creed Focus: We believe in the Holy Spirit... the Lord and Giver of Life...who with the Father and the Son together is worshiped and glorified.

Big Idea: The Holy Spirit is present, personal, living in, and leading His people.

Day 1 – I Believe in the Existence of the Holy Spirit

Scripture: Genesis 1:1-2, Joel 2:28, Acts 2:1-4, 16-18, John 14:16-17

Core Truth: The Holy Spirit is not an impersonal energy but the third Person of the Trinity — present from creation and poured out at Pentecost.

Reflection: How would your daily awareness change if you truly lived believing God's Spirit dwells within you?

Day 2 – I Believe in the Spirit Who Is Holy

Scripture: John 3:5-6, 2 Corinthians 5:17, Romans 8:14-16, Philippians 1:6

Core Truth: Spiritual transformation is not self-reinvention; it is the regenerating and sanctifying work of the Holy Spirit.

Reflection: Where have you seen the Spirit reshape your desires, fears, or habits over time?

Day 3 – I Believe the Holy Spirit Is Lord

Scripture: 2 Corinthians 3:17-18, Romans 8:1-2, Romans 8:11, John 16:7

Core Truth: Scripture identifies the Spirit as Lord — fully divine, life-giving, and worthy of obedience and worship.

Reflection: What would it look like for you to follow the Spirit's leading with the same surrender you give to Christ?

Day 4 – I Believe the Holy Spirit Proceeds from the Father and the Son

Scripture: John 15:26, John 16:13-15, Matthew 28:19, 2 Corinthians 13:14

Core Truth: The Spirit is not independent of the Father and Son but eternally related within the Trinity — equal in glory and worthy of worship.

Reflection: How does understanding the Spirit's unity with the Father and Son deepen your worship of the triune God?

Day 5 – If This Is True, Then...

Scripture: 1 Corinthians 3:16, Ephesians 6:12, Galatians 5:16

Core Truth: If the Spirit truly dwells within believers, then we are never alone, never powerless, and never without divine guidance.

Reflection: What simple prayer or step of obedience could mark a fresh dependence on the Holy Spirit this week?

WEEK 6 - God the Spirit — Empowering Mission

Creed Focus: The Lord, the Giver of Life... who has spoken through the prophets.

Big Idea: The Spirit brings life, builds unity, and guides God's people into truth and mission.

Day 1 – I Believe the Holy Spirit Is the Giver of Life

Scripture: Job 33:4, John 20:21–22, Ephesians 3:20, Acts 1:8

Core Truth: The Spirit is not symbolic breath but the divine life-giver — empowering believers for God's mission beyond their natural ability.

Reflection: Where is God calling you to step out in faith, trusting the Spirit's power rather than your own strength?

Day 2 – I Believe the Holy Spirit Unifies

Scripture: 1 Corinthians 12:12–13, Ephesians 2:21–22, 2 Corinthians 13:14, John 17:20–21

Core Truth: Christian unity is not organizational convenience but spiritual reality — the Spirit forms one body with different believers with a variety of gifts, talents, and abilities.

Reflection: How can you actively pursue unity in your church or community this week?

Day 3 – I Believe the Holy Spirit Reveals God's Word and Will

Scripture: Hebrews 1:1, 1 Peter 1:10–11, 1 Corinthians 2:9–12, Galatians 5:16

Core Truth: Scripture is not merely human insight; the Spirit inspired it and now illuminates it, guiding believers into truth consistent with God's Word.

Reflection: How can you create intentional space this week to listen for the Spirit's guidance?

Day 4 – I Believe the Holy Spirit Reveals Truth to Us**

Scripture: Romans 8:16, John 16:13, 1 John 3:24, Ephesians 1:17–19

Core Truth: The Spirit does not invent new truth but confirms the gospel, assures our identity in Christ, and deepens our understanding of what God has revealed.

Reflection: Where do you need the Spirit's assurance of your identity as a child of God?

Day 5 – If This Is True, Then...

Scripture: 1 Corinthians 3:16, Acts 2:42–47, Galatians 5:22–25

Core Truth: If the Spirit gives life, unites believers, and reveals truth, then our lives should display His fruit and our churches should reflect His presence.

Reflection: What evidence of the Spirit's life — fruit, unity, obedience, courage — do you long to see grow in you?

WEEK 7 - The Church — God's Scripture-Formed People Together**Creed Focus:** In accordance with the Scriptures...one apostolic Church.**Big Idea:** The Church is formed, corrected, and sustained by God's Word.**Day 1** – I Believe in the Scriptures**Scripture:** 1 Corinthians 15:1–4, Psalm 19:10, 2 Timothy 3:16**Core Truth:** The Creed doesn't replace Scripture—it submits to it; Christianity stands on the Gospel rooted "in accordance with the Scriptures."**Reflection:** Do you treat Scripture as helpful advice or as God's authoritative voice—and what would change if you treated it as authoritative His Word?**Day 2** – I Believe We Can Understand the Scriptures**Scripture:** Deuteronomy 6:6–7, Psalm 19:7, Psalm 119:130, Luke 24:25**Core Truth:** God is not hiding from His people—His Word is meant to be understood by ordinary believers as they listen humbly and seek His help.**Reflection:** Where do you most need a teachable heart as you read the Bible?**Day 3** – I Believe in Our Need for the Scriptures**Scripture:** Romans 10:13–17, Matthew 4:4, 1 Peter 2:2, Deuteronomy 29:29**Core Truth:** We cannot know the Gospel, God's will, or spiritual nourishment apart from God's Word—Scripture is necessary, not optional.**Reflection:** What would a realistic "daily bread" rhythm with Scripture look like for you this week?**Day 4** – I Believe the Scriptures Are Sufficient**Scripture:** 2 Timothy 3:14–15, 2 Timothy 3:16–17, James 1:22**Core Truth:** Scripture is sufficient to make us wise for salvation and equip us for every good work—no competing authority gets the final word over God's Word.**Reflection:** What's one area where you're tempted to look elsewhere first—and how can you intentionally turn to Scripture?**Day 5** – If This Is True, Then...**Scripture:** 2 Peter 1:20–21, Acts 2:42, Revelation 22:18–19**Core Truth:** If Scripture is God-breathed, clear, necessary, and sufficient, then the Church must devote itself to it—together, faithfully, without rewriting it.**Reflection:** How does your faith family help you understand and apply Scripture—and what step could strengthen that?

WEEK 8 - The Church — One, Holy, Universal, Apostolic

Creed Focus: We believe in one holy universal and apostolic Church...new birth...one Baptism...

Big Idea: The Church is Christ's body unified by the Spirit, set apart in holiness, and sent on mission.

Day 1 – I Believe in the Church

Scripture: Matthew 16:18, Acts 2:47, Ephesians 5:25, Colossians 1:28

Core Truth: The Church is not a building or brand but the redeemed people Christ is building — imperfect yet called and sustained by Him.

Reflection: How has your experience shaped your view of the Church — and how does Christ's love for the Church reshape it?

Day 2 – I Believe in the One, Holy Church

Scripture: John 17:20–23, Galatians 3:28, Ephesians 4:1–5, 2 Corinthians 5:21

Core Truth: Christian unity is grounded in shared faith in Christ, and holiness flows from the righteousness He gives us.

Reflection: Where might God be calling you to protect unity or pursue holiness within your local church?

Day 3 – I Believe in the Universal and Apostolic Church**

Scripture: Ephesians 1:22–23, Ephesians 2:19–21, Matthew 16:18, Acts 2:42

Core Truth: The Church is universal across time and culture, and apostolic because it is built on the teaching of Christ's commissioned witnesses.

Reflection: How does belonging to a global, historic Church shape your sense of identity and mission?

Day 4 – I Believe in the New Birth and One Baptism

Scripture: John 3:3–6, Ephesians 1:13, 1 Corinthians 12:13, Acts 1:8

Core Truth: Entrance into the Church is not inherited or earned — it comes through regeneration by the Spirit, who seals and empowers every believer.

Reflection: How does remembering your new birth in Christ renew your gratitude and boldness?

Day 5 – If This Is True, Then...

Scripture: Revelation 21:2, John 14:16–17, Acts 2:42–47

Core Truth: If the Church is Christ's bride, Spirit-filled and apostolically grounded, then unity, devotion, and mission are not optional—they are our calling.

Reflection: What practical step could you take this week to strengthen unity, pursue holiness, or serve Christ's body?

WEEK 9 - The Life of the World to Come

Creed Focus: He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead...His kingdom will have no end...we look for the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come.

Big Idea: Christ will return to judge, restore, and reign forever reshaping how we live today.

Day 1 – I Believe in the Life of the World to Come

Scripture: Mark 13:32, 2 Thessalonians 1:8–10, 1 Timothy 2:3–4, Revelation 21:3–4

Core Truth: Christian hope is not vague optimism but a promised future rooted in the resurrection of Jesus.

Reflection: If Christ has already defeated sin and death, how does that strengthen your confidence that He will finish what He started?

Day 2 – I Believe That Christ Will Return

Scripture: John 14:3, Acts 1:10–11, Matthew 24:44, Titus 2:13, Revelation 22:20

Core Truth: The same Jesus who rose and ascended will physically and visibly return.

Reflection: If Christ could return at any time, what would readiness look like in your daily life?

Day 3 – I Believe in the Final Judgment

Scripture: Revelation 20:11–15, Matthew 25:31–46, Romans 8:1, Romans 2:5–8, Ezekiel 33:11

Core Truth: Judgment is necessary because God is perfectly just. The cross proves He is also perfectly merciful.

Reflection: How does knowing there's no condemnation in Christ shape your confidence and compassion?

Day 4 – I Believe in the Resurrection and the New Heavens and Earth

Scripture: 2 Peter 3:13, Romans 8:21, Philippians 3:20–21, 1 Corinthians 15:42–44, Revelation 21:1–4, 23

Core Truth: Christian hope is the restoration of creation — resurrection bodies in a renewed world under Christ's eternal reign.

Reflection: How does the promise of a restored world help you endure suffering and live with courage today?

Day 5 – If This Is True, Then...

Scripture: Luke 12:37–40, Matthew 6:10, Matthew 24:14, 1 Peter 3:15

Core Truth: Future hope fuels present faithfulness — we live ready, holy, and on mission because the King is coming.

Reflection: If Jesus is returning to judge and restore, what needs to change in how you pray, serve, forgive, or share the gospel?
