Feel free to bring your pet(s) if they travel and socialize well. If they prefer to stay home a photo or an object representing them is a welcome substitute.





Meatball Supper | October 29


'Tis the season for meatballs!

Stewardship Drive FAQ

What is a stewardship drive?

A stewardship drive is a time for the congregation's finance committee and leadership to educate on church finances and to ask for pledges for the upcoming year. We hope that you received in the mail an envelope with some materials related to our stewardship drive including two things we hope you will return to Zion: a *pledge card* and a *time and talent form*. If you did not receive one, please let us know!

What is a pledge?

A pledge is an amount of money you/your household believe you will contribute to Zion in the next calendar year. Pledges are not promises or contracts, rather they are informed estimates which may change or fluctuate as your life changes and fluctuates. We ask for your pledge so that we can create a budget for the upcoming year that most closely aligns with the amount of money we will have in the coming year.

Who will see my pledge and how do I give?

Only our financial secretary, Paul Holm, will see your pledge. He takes his role as financial secretary very seriously and makes confidentiality a priority. Once all pledges are collected, Paul will share the total of all pledges made with the finance committee to begin working on a budget for 2026. Zion accepts your giving in various ways including in the plate (with or without

envelopes), on our website and through your bank. If you have questions about how to give, please ask Paul or contact the office.

What is the time and talent sheet for?

Money is only one aspect of stewardship. In our stewardship drive, we hope you will consider not only how you will financially support Zion, but also how you will support Zion through your time and talent in the coming year. Choir members share their time and talent by singing, property and groundskeepers share their time and talent to maintain our building and green spaces, bakers share their time, talent and resources to provide hospitality at fellowship and funerals. Each and every member and friend of Zion has something to offer the community – our hope is that through this stewardship drive, you might find it.

We have some particular needs that I'd like to highlight for you so you can prayerfully consider if you can support Zion in these ways which are needed in such a time as this.

- Filling the little food pantry: Our little food pantry gets filled nearly every day
 and is typically empty by the end of each day. We are looking for more
 people to come by to help make sure the pantry is stocked for our neighbors
 who need it.
- Volunteer coordinators: As your pastor, I need support in volunteer recruitment. I hope to find one or more people that I could call when I need help sourcing volunteers. This could be done from anywhere— even your couch!
- Video editing and uploading: Ever wonder how our services get on Facebook,
 CAT-7 and WKLK? A volunteer edits the recorded video and uploads them to each place. We could use more people to help with this ministry.

Thank you! Ministry at Zion is a joy to do alongside you as we seek to partner with God's creative and Holy Spirit in this time and place. As you prayerfully consider how God is calling you to share what God has given you, I encourage you to fill out and return your time and talent form and pledge cards by **November 9** as we prepare for the next year of ministry together.

Orchard & Grounds Help Needed!

Help on the grounds is needed! Thank you so much already for the help. This is a consistent need that will continue until the harvest is complete and the orchard is empty.

It is extremely important that as the apples fall in our organic, mature orchard that they are removed before rotting. Rotting apples can cause bitter rot and other diseases in the trees. They will also attract pests like wasps that become a nuisance. Good orchard management is key to the continuation of this gem on our property! We have over 20 trees and consistent tending is required over the next few months to maintain the health of the orchard!


