Second Sunday Surprise Intergenerational Sunday School: mark your calendars!







#### From the Pastors Desk | November



The ELCA's social statement on Faith and Civic life reminds us that as Lutherans, we are encouraged, and as Christians we are called, to be public witnesses and hold leaders accountable to preserve dignity and respect for all people, especially those who are marginalized and oppressed (see section 1, article 3; section 2, article 16).

The primary way we can make our voices heard and make change in the world is by voting. Election day is quickly approaching. If you haven't yet registered, there is still time! Plus, the State of Minnesota allows registration on voting day. Local and state elections are just as important as national elections as they impact our local community more directly.

You can be a part of making the change you want to see in the world by using your voice, advocating for justice for the marginalized and oppressed in our community, and casting your vote.

God of the fall colors and the frost, when you created the world, you called it good. When you created humans, you sought relationship with them in your garden; you sent your Son, Jesus Christ, to walk among your people; and you gifted us with the Holy Spirit for guidance. Help us to see the dignity in all people and to use our voices for policies, causes and changes that you call good. Guide us as we foster relationships among ourselves, engage in civic dialogue and strive to include you in all we do in the name of your Son, Jesus Christ, Amen.

## A Note from the Office: Change in Role

Dear Zion Friends & Siblings in Christ,

Thank you so much for your support of my call and vocation. I have learned so much from working here in the office at Zion and it has been an enormous part of my process of discernment. These last two and a half years, this work has nourished and stretched me, ultimately empowering me to pursue ordained leadership. For that, and so much more, I am so grateful!

Between the demands of seminary and the needs of my family I have reached the point at which I have to change my commitment level to other things in my life.

Because of this, I am submitting my official notice to Zion.

I will be stepping back from administrative duties at Zion and my last day in the office will be December 23<sup>rd</sup>.

I will be taking two weeks off after Christmas (Dec. 24-Jan. 7) to spend time with my family before my partner leaves for a long business trip. During January I will finish cleaning out the church office and preparing volunteers to take over different parts of the administrative work or training my replacement as well as taking a J-term class. Beginning February 1<sup>st</sup> I will be in my second semester at Wartburg Theological Seminary.

I will continue to be a volunteer liturgical assistant to Pastor Christina and Zion, as well as serving on the Altar Guild. Over the next few months I will be contributing liturgical themed articles in the monthly newsletter. I will also continue to design the weekly bulletin, writing and adapting liturgies for Zion, changing the liturgical textiles, designing posters for Zion's activities/bulletins/newsletters, and maintaining the church's website. My work will happen offsite, so the best way to contact me will be via email as I will not be checking the office phone.

Zion's Quilters meet on Tuesdays at 9a in the Social Hall.




