

He Will Hold Me Fast

1906

Ada Ruth Habershon (1861-1918) was an English Christian hymnist and writer best known for her 1907 gospel song “Will the Circle Be Unbroken,” the tune composed by Charles H Gabriel.

Habershon was born in Marylebone, England and was the youngest of four children to Samuel Osborne and Grace Habershon. She was raised in Chelsea, London in a Christian home. Her parents were part of the Plymouth Brethren movement whose pastor, Charles Spurgeon, became a close family friend.

Habershon studied at the Female School of Art in South Kensington. After leaving the school, she became involved in a number of Christian ministries. Between 1883 and 1889 she joined her parents working at a Gray’s Yard, a school providing education to children from poor backgrounds. Habershon met Dwight L. Moody and Ira D Snakey during their evangelistic mission in London in 1884.

After her parents’ death in 1889, Habershon explored avenues for service. In the 1890s she began writing and teaching on the Bible. At the request of D.L. Moody, Habershon visited the US to deliver lectures on the Old Testament. The visit lasted for several months, during which she traveled to Chicago, teaching at the Moody Bible Institute and the Moody Church. Some of her material was published in 1898 as *Types in the Old Testament*. In 1901 Habershon began writing poetry and hymns. She wrote over a 1,000 hymns.

In 1907 a collection of her hymns was published under the title *Twelve Sacred Songs*, including this current hymn *He Will Hold Me Fast*, which was published, at that time, in 64 hymnals.

Matthew Merker is a hymnwriter, author and worship leader from Long Island, NY. He is known for writing new and reimagining old hymns. He is director of creative resources and training for Getty Music and has contributed to several modern hymns, including this hymn. Merker set a new tune to the lyrics in 2013. “Merker’s version combines Habershon’s original four stanzas into two, with some minor alterations and adds an additional stanza featuring the resurrection and return of Christ.
