FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Friends in Christ,

By now, you will have celebrated Easter and the risen Savior, Jesus. I hope that you were blessed by this week of focusing our hearts on the Lord. Let's continue to tell people the joy that is within us through our faith in Christ. We have the best news that anyone could ever hear. Let's not keep it to ourselves.

Speaking of sharing the good news, our YouTube channel on the web just surpassed 400 video worship services uploaded. And we are up to 228 subscribers with over 80 folks visiting our channel every week. In addition to YouTube, we now have a podcast with the sermons available on Apple, Google, Spotify and Pod bean as well as several other podcast platforms. You can listen to the service on your smart phone from anywhere. Thanks to the tech team for pulling this off.

As we go into the Spring and then Summer, I want to share some changes that will be taking place. Beginning in August, when Sunday school restarts, all Sunday School classes will be meeting from 10am to 11am. The adult class and youth class are already doing this. But in August, pre-K through 5th grade will also be on this schedule. Instead of leaving worship before the sermon (at the 9am worship) to go to Sunday School, kids will remain in the worship service for the entire time. The only exception will be kids between 3 years old and 6 years old. We will be offering Children's worship during the sermon for this age group. This will be headed up by Cheryl Morgan and Sherri Lee Biele. Nursery will be

offered all through 9 am worship and Sunday School. We will also be working on offering nursery during the 11am worship as well. For the kids who are in worship, the Christian Ed committee will be putting together "worship" bags that will have Christian coloring pages and other items for kids if they get the fidgets during the sermon. All of this means that there will be a lot of moving parts beginning in the Sunday School Summer break. To facilitate some of this we will be looking for a Childcare **Director** to coordinate volunteers for the nursery and to work some of the slots during nursery. This is a part-time paid position. This is much more than just a job, this is a ministry to the church. See the description in this newsletter and let me know if you are interested. Finally, we will need volunteers for nursery, children's church and also helpers for Sunday School.

Our hope is to have the very best Children's ministry based on the Sunday morning Sunday School hour. I hope to have the very best Sunday School program in Lewes. This will take all of us to do this. This is the place where young people can have the opportunity to come to faith in Christ. Come help us make it happen. Talk to me or Cheryl or Amanda Swain or send us an e-mail.

Childcare Director Needed for Lewes Presbyterian Church

Because our nursery population has grown and because we want to be equipped for visitors with children, we are looking to hire a person to lead our nursery ministry on Sunday mornings. This person will recruit volunteers to staff the nursery at 9 am worship, 10 am Sunday school hour and 11 am worship as well. They will also help with the nursery personally by taking some of the nursery slots on Sunday.

Requirements: This person must be a practicing follower of Jesus and be in agreement with our church's beliefs. Knowledge of child health (first aid) and safety practices and prior experience working with infants and toddlers (having been a mom counts!) Interpersonal skills working with volunteers and organization skills would be helpful.

The three parts of the workshop are:


<u>April 7:</u> Process overview. Discussion and aids for developing your story.

Anchored - Do you feel God's peace in those stressful or unexpected situations?


God Provides Strength - Has God provided hope when you felt no hope of succeeding at something?

2024 Spring Bible Study


