

What a Friend We Have in Jesus

1855

Joseph Scriven (1819-1896) was born of prosperous parents in County Down, Ireland. He graduated from Trinity College, Dublin in 1842. In 1843 Scriven watched in shock as the body of his fiancée was pulled from the lake. Their wedding had been planned for the next day. In 1845 he decided to immigrate. Leaving his mother behind, he migrated to Ontario Canada. He was 25. In 1855, while in Canada, Scriven received word his mother was critically ill. He wrote the poem “Pray Without Ceasing” to comfort her. This poem was later set to music and renamed by Charles Converse, becoming *What a Friend We Have in Jesus*. The poem was published in the newspaper and later became a favorite hymn around the world.

In 1857 Scriven moved to Port Hope, Ontario where he again fell in love and was due to be married but in August 1860 his fiancée suddenly fell ill of pneumonia and died.

After this, Scriven devoted his life to tutoring, preaching and helping others, pouring himself into ministry in Port Hope, Canada, cutting firewood for widows, giving away his clothes and money to those in need. In 1869 Scriven published a collection of 115 “Hymns and Other Verses” which did not include *What a Friend We Have in Jesus*.

In 1896 Scriven became critically ill. At that time, it was not known he had a poetic gift. A neighbor, sitting with him in his illness, happened upon a manuscript copy of *What a Friend We Have in Jesus*. Asking Scriven about this, he said he had composed it for his mother to comfort her, not intending that anyone else should see it. On August 10, 1896, in his delirium, he rose from his bed and staggered outdoors where he fell into a small creek and drowned. He was 66. He is buried next to his second fiancée, Eliza Catherine Roche.
